VIGOROUSLY COMMENCE THIS WAY OF LIVING

"This thought brings us to Step Ten, which suggests we continue to take personal inventory and continue to set right any new mistakes as we go along. We vigorously commenced this way of living as we cleaned up the past. We have entered the world of the Spirit. Our next function is to grow in understanding and effectiveness. This is not an overnight matter. It should continue for our lifetime. Continue to watch for selfishness, dishonesty, resentment, and fear. When these crop up, we ask God at once to remove them. We discuss them with someone immediately and make amends quickly if we have harmed anyone. Then we resolutely turn our thoughts to someone we can help. Love and tolerance of others is our code.

And we have ceased fighting anything or anyone - even alcohol. For by this time sanity will have returned. We will seldom be interested in liquor. If tempted, we recoil from it as from a hot flame. We react sanely and normally, and we will find that this has happened automatically. We will see that our new attitude toward liquor has been given us without any thought or effort on our part. It just comes! That is the miracle of it. We are not fighting it, neither are we avoiding temptation. We feel as though we had been placed in a position of neutrality - safe and protected. We have not even sworn off. Instead, the problem has been removed. It does not exist for us. We are neither cocky nor are we afraid. That is our experience. That is how we react so long as we keep in fit spiritual condition.

It is easy to let up on the spiritual program of action and rest on our laurels. We are headed for trouble if we do, for alcohol is a subtle foe. We are not cured of alcoholism. What we really have is a daily reprieve contingent on the maintenance of our spiritual condition. Every day is a day when we must carry the vision of God's will into all of our activities. "How can I best serve Thee - Thy will (not mine) be done." These are thoughts which must go with us constantly. We can exercise our will power along this line all we wish. It is the proper use of the will.



December 23, 2019

OFFICER REPORTS:

Chair: (Justin C.) Thank you everyone for being here. Alkathon starts tomorrow and the Black and White Ball is on Saturday.

Vice Chair: (Amber H.) We had three new reps at orientation.

Secretary: (Erin H.) Minutes were passed.

Treasurer: (Susanne L.) The Central Office income for November 2019 includes \$2,923 from Group Contributions, \$25 from Group Insurance, and \$13 Bank Interest for a total of \$2,960. Total expenses for November were \$3,082. Bookstore income for November2019 includes \$5,382 in sales, \$25 from Group Insurance, and \$1,222 from the Thanksgiving Alkathon for a total of \$6,629. Overall we had a net loss of \$1,387 in November 2019. The Thanksgiving Alkathon came in \$206 dollars under budget. Our expenses were \$1,619. Our income was \$1,222.41 generating a \$396.59 loss for the event. Year-to-date, our income is \$149,417. Our expenses are \$126,265, leaving a net gain of \$23,153.

Looking for two volunteers for the bookstore: must have at least one year of sobriety, experience with cashier sales and using computers is helpful; schedules are for four hours every other week.

INTERGROUP TREASURER'S REPORT - DECEMBER 2019

The Central Office income for December 2019 includes \$2,772 from Group Contributions, \$50 from Group Insurance, and \$11 Bank Interest for a total of \$2,833. Total expenses for December were \$3,382.

The Bookstore income for December 2019 includes \$6,476 in sales, \$50 from Group Insurance, \$2,529 from Alkathons, and \$715 from Activities (Winter Dance) for a total of \$9,770. Total expenses for December were \$10,604.

Overall we had a net loss of \$1,383 in December 2019.

Both the Christmas and New Year's Alkathons saw net gains in the amount of \$554.88 and \$438.99 respectively.

Year-to-date, our income is \$162,082. Our expenses are \$140,264, leaving a net gain of \$21,818.
