GENERAL SERVICE NEWS

The Twelve Traditions make clear the principle that A.A., as such, should never be organized, that there are no bosses and no government in A.A. Yet the Traditions also recognize the need for some kind of organization to carry the message in ways that are impossible for the local groups – such as publication of a uniform literature and public information resources, helping new groups get started, publishing an international magazine, and carrying the message in other languages into other countries. This is carried out in the US & Canada through the structure of “General Services.” This method is the way A.A.’s group consciences can speak out and put its desires to the Conference for these services. It is a structure that takes the place of government in A.A. ensuring that the full voice of A.A will be heard.

This is done is through the sharing sessions that taking place in a lot of meetings. This is the process that makes sure every voice, every group (that has a GSR), is heard regarding new literature, any possible changes in Public Information & Cooperation with the Professional Community, Treatment & Accessibilities, the Grapevine (just to name a few of the committees). The Committees in the General Service Conference structure strive to make in one way or another Twelve Step services available. We all are striving to continue to “widen the gateway.”

We will be having the Pre-conference Assembly right here in Santa Rosa at the Vets Building on April 13 & 14th. If you think this General Service is a bit mysterious, come on over, check it out. We will have business in the morning, some presentation of new business and an old business matter about asking our General Service Conference to consider creating a pamphlet on meditation. Be there when someone reaches out for help

The Sonoma County Teleservice Committee is an autonomous group of volunteers that runs and staffs the A.A. hotline; providing personal contact to the alcoholic who still suffers, around the clock, seven days a week.

The Teleservice Committee reports to the Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship Board, the organization that runs the A. A. Central Office.

We recruit, train and schedule volunteers to staff the 24-hour hotline, to offer a helping hand to the alcoholic in distress. We provide information to callers about meeting schedules and changes, answer questions about A.A. and to refer callers in need to 12th-Step volunteers. We also provide contact information for detox and residential facilities, alcoholism services in other areas, and information to family members and friends of alcoholics, including contact information for Alanon and Alateen.

Right now, Teleservice needs volunteers to answer the hot-



line over four-hour shifts during the day and evening, or overnight. The hotline calls are forwarded to the volunteer's personal phone number. Volunteers must have one year of continuous sobriety, familiarity with the Steps and Traditions, and have completed an orientation/training. Volunteers will be provided written materials including a manual and contact information. Since most folks get their information over the internet, the hotline is not as busy these days as it was "back in the day." But is very satisfying to assist that caller who is really struggling with the disease. For further information or to volunteer, contact Mike H. at (415) 310-9154 or Teleservice@sonomacountyaa.org.

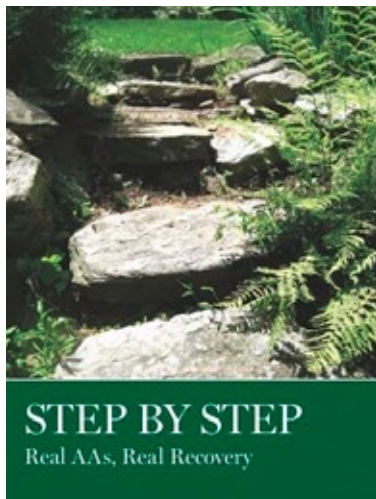

PI/CPC is a branch of AA General Service. The initials stand for Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community. The committee provides informational speakers to outside groups who seek to learn more about AA, including classes of the Sonoma County Drinking Driver Program health and social studies classes at local high schools, and groups in the legal, medical, educational, theological and law enforcement professions. Our responsibilities also include the distribution of AA literature to anyone who requests it.

Speakers undergo a short training session at one of our monthly committee meetings, and then observe a presentation before going on to speak themselves. Most speakers enjoy the experience, and find this branch of AA service to be quite rewarding.

If you are interested in learning more about PI/CPC you are welcome to attend one of our business meetings. Meetings are held at 7:30 PM on the second Wednesday of each month, at the Santa Rosa City Hall employees lounge in the underground parking garage. Treasurer: (Suzanne L.) Group contributions for February were \$9,061 which was \$5,382 more than February of last year, we received \$10 from bank interest and \$150 in group insurance fees for a total of \$9,220 and after expenses we had a net gain of \$1,640. Bookstore income was \$7,923 and after expenses we had a net gain of \$332. We received \$150 in group insurance fees. Overall, we had a net gain of \$1,864. All signers have been updated and signatures received.

Registrar: (Max B.) As of February 28, 2019, there were 237 groups in Sonoma County offering 346 meetings each week. There are 173 meeting representatives on record, for 73% participation. There were 51 representatives attending the January 2019 General Meeting, for 30% participation.
