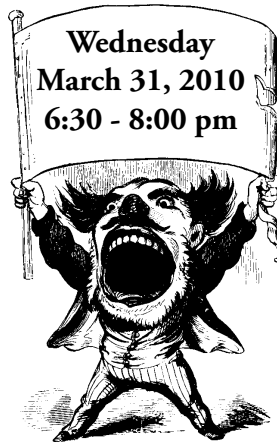

The "dual diagnosis" workshop

Many of us are familiar with the first paragraph of the Big Book's Chapter 5 ("How It Works"), "There are those, too, who suffer from grave emotional and mental disorders, but many of them do recover, if they have the capacity to be honest." Access Sonoma County (ASC) took this as the title for its "dual diagnosis" workshop: "AA's Promise: 'Many of them do recover...'"

The workshop will address mental health issues among AA members. Topics include: What is dual diagnosis? What barriers do members with a mental health diagnosis face? What problems do groups encounter? What AA principles guide us? Interpretation/translation will be provided for Spanish speakers and ASL speakers.

AA members with mental health issues have relapsed or died because of comments heard in AA meetings, or from sponsors or other AA's. Some members see mental health issues only in terms of disruptions to meetings by mentally ill members. Both sides of this issue will be addressed by panel members sharing the direct experience of AA members with mental-health diagnoses, those who sponsor them or work with them professionally, and others, including sharing from members attending the workshop. And we will examine what our AA literature says about this issue.

ASC has been exploring this issue since May 2009. Last year, there was much interest in a potential new GSO pamphlet addressing mental health issues. ASC has invited the entire California Northern Coastal Area to participate in this workshop, so we expect participation by more than 100 local and Area members. Look for flyers at your meetings in the next few weeks. If you would like to attend, arrive early – we may run out of room!
