

With BTG, a volunteer will call someone who has just been released from a facility (that has expressed interest in being contacted) and offer to go to a meeting with them, answer questions and introduce them to other alcoholics.

There's a lot that goes on behind the scenes to make all of this happen. We have men's and women's phone coordinators, liaisons to other sub-committees, presenters that go into facilities and more!

If you are interested in learning more about BTG, you are always welcome to check us out on the third Tuesday of the month at the Bookstore. New volunteer orientation is at 6:00pm, and the business meeting is at 6:30pm. It's a great and rewarding way to be of service!
