Officer Reports:

Chair: (Sean McP.) Last month we started handing out a new reporting form. Can I see show of hands of those who are finding it useful? (Many hands up). I'd like to ask for a hand of applause for the committee who works so hard. Also for yourselves

Vice Chair: (Doug S.) I do an orientation before the meeting for the new reps, if you didn't come this month, please come next month.

Recording Secretary: (Siobhan S.) May minutes were accepted as printed with one spelling correction.

Treasurer: (Shirley J.) Group contributions of \$1,397 were disappointing in May, more than \$1071 less than May 2009. Group supported expenses exceeded contributions by \$2646, Bookstore expenses exceeded income by \$215, resulting in \$2431 net loss overall.

Registrar: (Rich S.) In May we had 357mtgs/week, 169 reps, for 47% group representation

Bookstore Report: (Steve B. for Linda M.) Bookstore is doing fine. Thanks to all the volunteers for the inventory.

Committee Reports:

ICSC: (Steve B.) 3people serve in this committee [plus the Intergroup Chair and Treasurer]. The bookstore is doing fine, had a small loss, but is non-profit so like to stay about even. Volume of sales is up, so we're ahead. Linda not here tonight due to hours put in at inventory; she only does 100hrs/mo. Got a new computer for \$400, a great deal.

Activities: (Kathy M.) The picnic went great, thanks to all the volunteers. Next event will be Hot August Nights; music, dancing, BBQ, raffle.

Communications/Newsletter: (Brian Z.) Always looking for material- letters to the editor, etc. Have found an apprentice - help is always welcome and the Communications meeting is open to all.

Alkathons: (vacant)

Outreach: (DeeDee S.) I have a new, organized list of unrepresented meetings, looking for volunteers to help visit those meetings.

Seminars: (Doug S. for Karen M.) Please see pg. 2 of the newsletter. The last seminar was full to overflowing, so we will be moving the next two seminars to the Comm. of Christ Church at W. Steele Ln. and Range Ave. We are also now recording the seminars for people unable to attend. Next seminar Anonymity on the Internet.

Teleservice: (Rob S.) Lots of shifts open, Mondays, 7am-1pm, 5pm-10pm, and overnight 10pm-9am, alternate Wednesdays 2-6pm, and Friday 1-6pm. Please push the importance of Teleservice at your meetings!!

Liaison Reports:

BTG: (Glenn C.) BTG is a sub-committee of General Service whose purpose is to "bridge the gap" for people in treatment facilities and the first AA meeting they attend upon release. We match interested people with AA members of the same sex, roughly the same age, and in the same neighborhood, to take them to their first AA meeting upon release.

Group Contributions and the Pink Can

We ask that the group contribution basket be passed completely before the Pink Can is passed and that the Pink Can is not passed inside the group basket. That the Pink Can either be passed after the group basket is completed or be left on the table with a brief announcement about the purpose of the Pink Can.

As long as there are confined alcoholics there is the need to purchase AA books to bring the message of Alcoholics Anonymous to them.

We have a letter called What Are Those Pink Cans For? which states "One of the fears expressed early on in the implementation of the Pink Cans was that they would subtract from the support of the meetings. The entire letter is available on our website at www. handinorcal.org.

More volunteers are also needed to bring those AA books into the hundreds of facilities we go into each month. It is when one alcoholic shares with another alcoholic that the message of hope is carried, so consider this 12th Step service and attend your Area H&I Committee Meeting to get involved.

In her 5-minute share, Cindy W. told of how she got into this "God thing" that was H&I service. She had found that she was drifting away from AA and thought she'd check out the Committee and found it to be a great eye-opener; it brought her love of AA back into her life. She developed a spiritual connection with others, especially during the "meeting before the meeting." Her first thought, as with so many of us, on taking meetings into the jails was, "I have nothing to offer" (having never been incarcerated). She soon realized that it wasn't about being in jail, it was all about being in Life—and that is what AA and being in service is all about.

GENERAL SERVICE

Self Support: Where Money and Spirituality Mix

I remember when I was new I heard the words "There are no dues or fees for AA membership". At that time I was not too keen on paying my way for anything, let alone recovery from a hopeless state of mind and body. Being free made it somewhat appealing, I thought. That was until my sponsor talked to me about self support through my own contributions. Years later I became a treasurer for a group. One of my first tasks was to talk to the group about self support through our own contributions. You see, the meeting place cost \$12 to rent but there were only 7 of us in the group. As I explained the math as best I could it meant that putting a dollar in the basket was not going to keep the doors open. If we wanted to have this meeting here for the new person walking in the door we all had to dig in our pocked, a little deeper. They did and I watched that meeting grow to be fully self supporting.

There is a little known pamphlet called "The AA Group Treasurer". In that pamphlet it says "... it is important to remember that the money the treasurer oversees serves a spiritual purpose: it enables each group to fulfill its primary purpose of carrying the AA message to the alcoholic who stills suffers. This is the fundamental work of AA and to continue it the group must keep its doors open". Putting money in the basket is part of my 12 step work. Knowing if my home group is making all of its financial obligations is part of my 12 step work. I get to work today because I am sober from a hopeless state of mind and body. What I put in the basket is part of how I show my gratitude. There are no dues of fees. I get to give today. It is part of how I practice spirituality.


