## PICPC NEWS

### One is enough

For the past dozen years I've been in service as a speaker, representing Alcoholics Anonymous to people attending the county's Drinking Driver Program. I do this through a committee known as PICPC, or Public Information (in) Cooperation with the Professional Community, a subcommittee of General Service. I find this form of service both interesting and rewarding.

The interest comes from getting out of my A.A. comfort zone and sharing my story with people outside the fellowship. The reward comes from staying sober myself, and holding out the hand of hope to anyone who may be feeling what I felt when I was struggling with my addiction.

The county invites us to speak at these classes, and over the years I've seen co-workers and a number of friends and acquaintances in the audience. They are usually shocked to see me, but I always assure the group that we respect their anonymity as faithfully as we protect our own. I also assure them that neither we nor the county make any judgment regarding their use of alcohol. Our purpose is to provide information only. We are not there on a recruiting mission.

To emphasize that fact I read them our Preamble. This eloquent document wipes out the myths and misconceptions, and it states our principles and purpose with such clarity that there is nothing left to fear or resent. The Preamble's truth and simple dignity inspire respect, and respect stimulates interest. Some groups are more interested than others, but a group that actively engages can be its own reward.

Have my efforts made a difference? I have no way of knowing. But if even one person has found hope from despair – it's been worth all the effort I've ever put into it. If you think this service might interest you please come to our next PI/CPC business meeting and check it out. Meetings are held at 7:30 P.M. on the second Wednesday of every month - at the Santa Rosa City Hall employees lounge, next to the underground parking garage. We look forward to seeing you.

Remember our statement to keep this gift of sobriety we must give it away. We have this Twelfth Step opportunity in Bridging the Gap. We have the privilege of doing for the newcomer what someone did for us. Here's what BTG needs:

- Area Correspondence Secretary opening; volunteer needs to pick up BTG mail once weekly, should have computer skills and access, attend Area Meeting in Petaluma on the 4th Saturday of each month for 2 hours. (Come to Bookstore on August 16th at 6PM.)
- Volunteers to take newcomers just out of treatment to their first meeting. Just fill out a yellow card (or flyer) and show up for orientation at the bookstore on the third Tuesday of the Month (August 16th) at 6PM. We are most in need of residents in the West, East, and North County.
- AA's to be presenters at the assorted venues we currently and plan to present our message of hope. These facilities include Mountain Vista Farm, Azure Acres, Turning Point, Kaiser, North County Jail, and, possibly Orenda Detox. Come to our orientation on the third Tuesday (August 16th) at 6 PM.
- A pressing need AA's who are or are willing to be cleared for Sonoma county jail for presentations at the North County (or honor farm).
- Young at hearts as well as younger in bodies! We encounter countless Millennium generation types at the treatment centers. Newcomers—especially—relate better with their own age group. Come to Orientation Tuesday, August 16th at 6PM.
- Newcomer request data not available by press time.

Remember how we suffered from "pitiful and incomprehensible demoralization" and how some stranger took us by the hand to lead us to our personal miracle? We have the opportunity to share that miracle with the newcomer who is lost as we show the path to freedom from our disease.

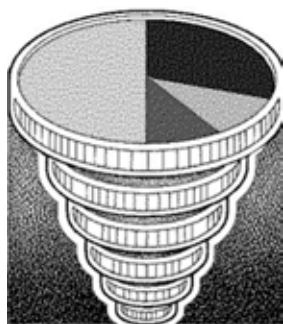
