A blog from <u>www.aaqrapevine.orq</u> asked the question: When visiting social media web sites how do I maintain my anonymity? 34% answered, "I might discuss AA or Sobriety, but I never reveal I'm a member." 24% answered, "I use separate accounts so that I can maintain anonymity while talking about AA recovery." 42% answered, "I don't care if I break my anonymity."

A single respondent, identified as Anonymous, wrote, "My anonymity is critical to my work. I have, in my 21 years sober, been written out of a large will, lost clients, and lost jobs all due to other well meaning people breaking my anonymity because "its not a big deal for them." The big book is pretty clear on



this 'We fiercely guard our anonymity and that of our member s."

"With that said, I live in a fairly remote state and access is important. I have a Facebook page and I have settings so that others' friends can't read my friends' posts... I also started a sober page for friends of Bill that is secret. Posts show up on my page to me only. Anyone looking at my page will not see them and the same is true for all members. It's a page, not a group or meeting, but, it is a place to share the message of recovery. It doesn't replace 'face to face,' but it surely supplements it."

A Facebook blog that I accidentally found was peppered with responses by supposed members using their full names! Worse yet, since I have a FB account, people can probably resource me, online. This would allow them

member friends and family. And, because I'm attached to this new blog, they can probably reach the conclusion that I and many of my FB friends are members of A.A

I notice that many of those FB friends also refer to their A.A. birthdays, have group photos, and give advice to other members, online. Many of us seem to be inadvertently violating the Eleventh Tradition, "we need always maintain personal anonymity at the levels of press, radio and films."

And, if breaking the Eleventh Tradition isn't bad enough, some of the FB blogs also receive advertising from companies peddling other solutions for drug and alcohol addiction-- for a price. This could be a violation of Traditions 6 and 7.

So, the age of technology seems to be a blessing and a very big challenge if we are to preserve the Traditions.
