TIPS FOR SECRETARIES

Notes from Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship "Workshop for AA Meeting Secretaries"

Workshop Date: October 22, 2008 – Panelists: Laurie, Rich, John

Seminar Committee Chair: Doug S

I attended this "Workshop for AA Meeting Secretaries" to learn about making the meetings I chair more effective and to share my questions with other AA meeting Secretaries. The suggestions I gained were immediately put to use in our fellowship. Here are a few things I picked up that I would like to share.

Secretary's Qualifications/Responsibilities:

- Secretaries should be representative of AA membership—a reflection of AA while sitting at front desk. They are often respected/looked up to by newcomers and can offer them guidance.
- Ask yourself: "Do I as the Secretary have what people want?"
- Good secretaries work with their sponsor and are able to carry the message of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions

Sobriety Requirements for Secretary:

- Not enough sobriety can ultimately lead to the downfall of the group. The AA brochure entitled "The AA Group" recommends a year of sobriety for Secretary along with a working knowledge of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions.
- The panelists strongly suggest that the requirements for primary positions (i.e., Secretary, treasurer, GSR) should not be waived. In most cases the group has already agreed on the sobriety requirements—and these should be considered written in stone, and not easily changed.
- If a Secretary relapses you might say something to the tune of: "there is probably a reason for your relapse; perhaps you are feeling overwhelmed and feeling obligated to carry on as Secretary because you were elected." Let them know that they are allowed to step down and take care of themselves. If no one is stepping up to the plate, God may let them know that they should be.
- Regarding "rotation" from page 26 of the "The AA Group" brochure. To step out of an AA office you love can be hard. If you have been doing a good job, if you honestly don't see anyone else around willing, or with the time to do it...it's especially hard.

Meeting Specific:

- Organize meeting information into a binder to pass on; have all phone numbers in it. When your term is complete, spend time prepping the new Secretary.
- Have Newcomer Packets pre-assembled and available on front desk. Sample Newcomer Packet might include: meeting schedule; phone list, one of the newcomer brochures, maybe a book.
- Go to a lot of meetings so you can see how other Secretaries run them.
- Speaker Selection: make sure they're going to talk about AA, not NA. Try to hear them share before you ask them to speak. Ask them to keep the language clean. Remind them that they have X minutes to "share their story", or their experience about the first 3 Steps", or whatever your typical format/theme is. Keep a list of good speakers you have heard in different meetings so you'll always have a list of potential speakers.
- Be a strong, consistent leader. Keep things in check.
- Read the brochure called "The AA Group" cover-to-cover as it an excellent source of information about being a Secretary and how the group functions best. Encourage your meeting to read it as well.
- Make sure you have the necessary chips for chip meetings. Invite people to bring their own chips to save money. Or invite them to bring their old chips in to be recycled.
- Volunteers in Key positions (Secretary, Treasurer, and GSR) should have working knowledge of the 12 Steps and 12 Traditions.
- Do not allow non-alcoholics to speak. They can attend open meetings, but they cannot speak or have service positions.
- Having a strong supportive Steering Committee is a real plus.
- Even if you have a greeter for your meeting, do circulate and introduce yourself to newcomers.

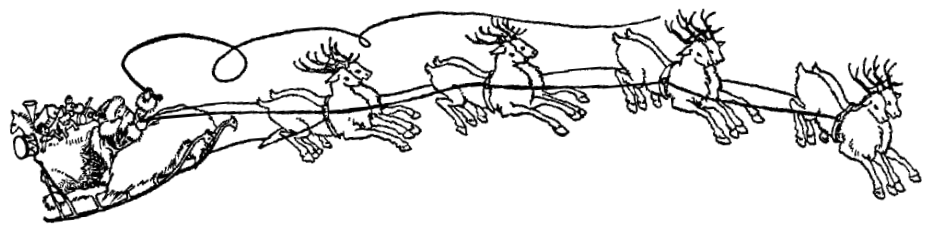
Happy Holidays Fellowship!

OFFICER REPORTS:

CHAIR: Diane W. – Diane gave an overview of what the Chair service position involves. The meetings at Palm Drive Hospital in Sebastopol must move to a new location starting Nov. 1 until further notice due to construction. The dates for the November and December SCIF General meetings will remain on the 4th Monday, as there is no conflict with the holidays this year.

VICE CHAIR: Bob P. – There were 9 new Intergroup Reps at the orientation tonight. If new Reps have questions about Intergroup, they can call Bob-his phone number is on the back of the newsletter.

TREASURER: Pat H. – Overall income exceeded expenses in September by \$776, mostly due to group contributions of \$5,904 for the month. Bookstore expenses exceeded income by \$868, yet bookstore sales remain up by \$2,694 for the first nine months of the year. The bookstore inventory has been reduced by \$10,000 since the beginning of 2008. The current level of inventory is ~3 month supply.

SECRETARY: Donna L. – The September SCIF General Meeting minutes published in the November newsletter were approved without changes.

REGISTRAR: Nan B. – In September, there were 356 AA meetings/week in Sonoma County. Of those, 114 (32%) were represented at the September SCIF General Meeting.

BOOKSTORE: Linda M. – Two volunteer shifts are open at the bookstore – Monday 2-6pm and Thursday 2-6pm. Anyone with >1 year of sobriety and a working knowledge of the steps qualifies for the position. Call Linda for more information. The Central Office Managers conference that Linda attended in Canada was informative and fun. In the Archives workshop, speakers were encouraging groups to write their histories, as archives are useful living histories. There was also talk of developing books with “old-timers” recollections of home groups and central offices. AAWS will raise book prices in July 2009. The bookstore will have a new Grapevine publication available soon titled “Beginners Book”.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

ICSC: Gene H. – Bookstore operations are going smoothly. Sales are up and inventory is down. Linda is doing a great job managing the bookstore. The new Point of Sale (POS) system will be up and running soon. There was a minor adjustment made to the bookstore renovation plan that will not affect the cost. Volunteers are needed for construction prep work on November 23. Call Gene at 481-4824 to help. ICSC terms have been adjusted with the new by-laws approval. One position will vacate in 2009 and two in 2010.

ACTIVITIES: Laurie E. – The Halloween Dance was very successful. The New Year's Eve dance theme will be “2009 Leagues Under the Enchanted Sea”. Volunteers are needed.

ALKATHONS: Barbara F. – There will be an Alkathon Steering meeting on Monday, November 3 at 8pm at the Starbucks on Farmers Lane in Santa Rosa. The Thanksgiving Alkathon will start 6pm Nov. 26 and the last meeting will begin 10pm Nov. 27. Lots of food is needed, please bring some to share.

NEWSLETTER: Brian Z. – The newsletter is full of great info. If you have info to include send via email to aanews@ap.net. The Communications Committee, with technical expertise from our webmaster Sam K., has been discussing updating and expanding the Sonoma County AA website. The site address is www.sonomacountyaa.org. This will be discussed further at the November 10th SCIF Steering Committee meeting, and we will be reporting more about this next month.

OUTREACH: Sean M. – Sean gave a brief description of the Outreach Chair position description. He continues to request and appreciate help in attending meetings that don't have Intergroup Reps and encouraging them to elect and send one.

SEMINARS: Doug S. – Thank you to Reps for spreading the word about the Secretary's workshops, they were well-attended. Two useful resources that can be picked up at the bookstore are “Group Secretary's Guide” and “The AA Group”.

TELESERVICE: Dave R. – There are 4 open overnight shifts: Sunday, Wednesday, Thursday and Friday. Shifts are approximately 10pm to 6am and average 2-3 calls per night. Volunteers take calls at home, and do not need to stay up all night.

LIAISON REPORTS:

BRIDGING THE GAP: John B. – BTG's purpose is to “bridge the gap” between AA meetings in prisons, hospitals and treatment facilities and the first meetings inmates and patients go to upon release into their home communities. Anyone interested in volunteering should have 6+ mos. of sobriety and a working knowledge of the steps.

HOSPITAL AND INSTITUTION COMMITTEE: Mark V. – Come to H&I business meeting to get involved in bringing AA meetings and literature to people who can't get out to meetings.

PI/CPC: Nick R. – PI/CPC delivers literature to police stations, jails, libraries and senior centers. They send speakers into the community, including DUI classes. Committee Chair elections will take place at the November 12 business meeting.

SOCYPAA: Sean M. (Jamie Y. –absent) The recent outing to the Corn Maze was great. They will have a Broomball event with SACYPAA (in Sacramento) on November 22. There will also be a Game Night at the Santa Rosa Alano Club on December 13. The 2009 ACYPAA Conference will be held March 13-15 in Orange County. Info is at www.acypaa.org

ACCESS SONOMA COUNTY: Pat N. – (Jamie T. absent) Access Sonoma County is encouraging members with disabilities to fill out the blue survey forms “ASC ASKS YOU” so they can better serve the needs of members with access issues. The 7pm Monday night meeting in Petaluma no longer offers childcare.

GENERAL SERVICE: Padee M. (Lauralyn C. absent) Unity Day was great, they loved the venue. The BTG Forum was like a mini-conference as it drew folks from all over. The District Meeting is on Nov. 3 at 7:30 pm. GSR's will be attending the Election Assembly at Calistoga Fairgrounds on November 8 all day. Your contributions to General Service support Access Sonoma County (ASC), Bridging the Gap (BTG), and Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community (PI/CPC).

UNITY DAY: Shirley J. – Unity Day went very well, and Intergroup's commitments were well done. There will be a wrap-up meeting Wednesday, November 5 at 6:30pm at the bookstore.

OLD BUSINESS: Motion Passed: That SCIF proceed with a renovation project to enlarge the bookstore area to make more efficient use of space, at a cost not to exceed \$5,400.

Vote: 65-Yes, 0-No, 7-Abstain

SUMMATION: Bob reviewed items to bring back to groups for discussion.

The meeting was closed with the Lord's Prayer.

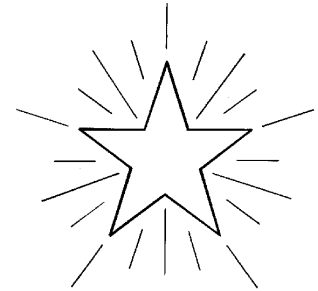
