



Officer Reports:

Chair: (Steve B.) Welcome everyone. Will be voting on an ICSC position later. Have a housekeeping motion to put forward to the group. Steve went through who can vote and explained what a housekeeping motion entails. Housekeeping Motion: To change General Meeting date for December from the 24th (Christmas Eve) to the 17th. There being one person not in favor, Steve used chairs rules and asked the group to vote on the motion. Unanimously passed.

Vice Chair: (Trevor H.) New reps that did not go to orientation please see Carolyn after meeting to sign in and see me for your orientation packet.

Secretary: (Patty G.) September 24, 2012 General Meeting minutes put forth and approved.

Treasurer: (Jimmie B.) Group contributions for September were \$1,892 which is \$1,830 less than September 2011. After group-supported expenses, we had a net loss of \$1,578. Bookstore income was \$6,674 and after expenses had a net loss of \$570. Unity Day net income was \$273. Overall we had a net loss for Central Office and Bookstore of \$1,875.

Registrar: (Carolyn A.) Last month 230 groups offered 373 meetings per week in Sonoma County and at Septembers' General Meeting there were 82 representatives for a 36% representation.

Bookstore report: (Linda M.) Central Office/Bookstore hours will change with daylight savings November 5 – Monday through Thursday 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Friday 10 a.m. to 6 p.m., and Saturday 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. Attended the AAWS Intergroup Central Office Manager's seminar in Maryland. Attended five workshops and two evening presentations. AAWS announced there will be no price increase for books in 2013 and they are implementing cost cutting measures at the general office. Thanks to Jamie T. who donated a refurbished Dell computer to the office and Dave H. for installing.

ICSC: (Sean M.) ICSC is responsible for the operation of the Intergroup Office/Bookstore as well as advising the Steering Committee on matters affecting SCIF's non-profit status. Will be doing annual review of bookstore manager by end of the year.

Accurate Information About Alcoholism and A.A.

The temperature is a perfect Northern California 75 degrees, with a light breeze right now as I bask in the early November sunshine, feeling amazingly content with my life. It's about 1:30 in the afternoon and my mind drifts back to a place in time a bit over 21 years ago. I had reached a bottom in my miserable, chaotic, alcoholic life. My then husband and I had initiated what was to be a devastating separation for

me, and I was seeing a therapist. Although I cried through most of the first session or two, my therapist was able, in his wisdom to gather enough information from me to make a suggestion that I try attending a couple of A.A. meetings! As desperate as I was, I trusted this man, and I was willing to try anything he suggested if it might relieve the pain I was feeling.

The sense of belonging, relief and hope that I found after just my first A.A. meeting was beyond wonderful! I really believed a happy, joyous, and free new life awaited me. I was

so grateful that my therapist knew enough about A.A. to suggest it to me.

It would be many years of sobriety later that I would learn about our committee Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community Committee (PI/CPC), and their job: To give accurate information about Alcoholics Anonymous to the public and to professionals who work with alcoholics (like my therapist).

Today, I am reminded of the gratitude that is expressed to me by recipients and benefactors of our presentations. I have heard it said "Greater love has no one than this, than to lay down his life for his friends." So, to our committee members and speakers, who lay down their lives each time they go out to speak and share, we are eternally grateful for your service and we say "Thanks to you lives are truly being transformed and saved!"

Please join us on this life saving journey. PI/CPC meets the second Wednesday of every month at City Hall (Employees Lounge by underground parking) in Santa Rosa. Speaker training is at 7 p.m. and the business meeting follows from 7:30-8:30 p.m.
