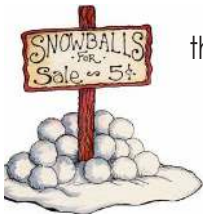

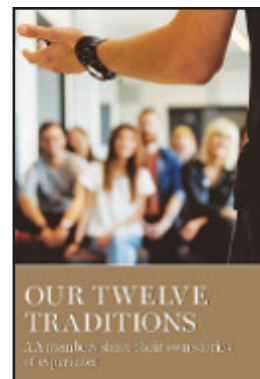


## BOOKSTORE

ICSC Committee: Diane W. won with 28 votes, Gary S. had 27 votes.

**OFFICER REPORTS:**

CHAIR: Barry D. – Unity Day was great, thanks to all who participated and attended. Paid CPA job description should be done soon – recruitment opens within 2 weeks. Applications for Assistant Bookstore Manager due Nov. 11 – hope to hire by end of year. This is Ryn L.’s last night as ICSC Chair – she has done fantastic work, including the SCIF organizational chart (handout at table) and ICSC position description.

VICE CHAIR: James C. – There were 7 new Intergroup reps at orientation tonight. If you are new and didn’t attend, come to orientation next month.

SECRETARY: Donna L. in for Cona E. – 9/26/16 SCIF General Meeting Minutes accepted with edit (meeting minutes on page two should read September 26, 2016)

TREASURER: Carolyn A. - Group contributions for September were \$2,232 and an individual contribution for \$50 total \$2,282 which was \$1,251 less than September of last year and after expenses we had a net loss of \$1,428. Bookstore income was \$7,380 and after expenses we had a net gain of \$388. Overall, we had a net loss of \$1,039 and year to date we are \$4,952 less than 2015.

REGISTRAR: Linda W. – As of today we have 245 AA Groups in Sonoma County offering 352 meetings/week. There are 133 Intergroup reps registered (54% participation). There were 90 Intergroup reps, including 8 new reps, at the September SCIF general meeting (68% participation).

BOOKSTORE REPORT: Glenn C. – sale book for November will be “Spiritual Awakenings II” at \$10 +tax (20% off). Applications for Assistant Bookstore Manager (paid) position are at bookstore. Time commitment is 25 hrs/month. Bookstore winter hours in effect November 7th: Mon-Thurs 10am-5pm; Fri 10am – 6pm, Sat 11am-3pm.

Sonoma County Intergroup Fellowship (SCIF) is seeking a member of the fellowship to be contracted as CPA.

#### Job requirements and qualifications:

- Licensed CPA
- Length of Sobriety: 5 Years
- Active in service to Alcoholics Anonymous
- Working knowledge of 12 Steps and 12 Traditions

#### Description of Duties:

- Prepare Annual Tax Reports:
- Short Form (990-EZ) Exempt Organization Tax Return (Federal)
- Form 199, California Exempt Organization Annual Information Return
- Registration Renewal Fee Report to Attorney General of California with a copy of 990-EZ attached.
- Statement of Information to Secretary of State of California
- Support bookkeeper as needed, especially at year-end to assist with a clean cutoff, prudent reserve adjustment and calculate donation distributions. Verify that documented Internal Controls and separation of duties are being maintained.

Note that full income statement and beginning and ending balance sheet are required to be provided to members each year. We publish them in the February newsletter. They are prepared by the bookkeeper and signed off by the Treasurer – no CPA compilation required.

Professional guidance to ICSC as needed. Assist with accounting questions that might arise and ensure corporate entity remains current and adheres to SCIF By-laws and Policies and Procedures regarding corporate governance. (See ICSC Fact Book and Appendices)

Tax reports..... 8 - 12 hours/year  
Bookkeeper support... 10 – 15 hours/year  
Other..... Variable 10- 30 hours  
Compensation: \$1,500 per year
