SPONSORSHIP CONTRACT

A.A. sponsors do not all work in the same way, but all sponsors present the A.A. program by guiding a fellow alcoholic through the 12 Steps as described in the first 164 pages of the book ALCOHOLICS ANONYMOUS. Sponsors are not counselors or therapists. As a sponsor, here is what I will and will not do for you:

1. I'll offer you guidance and encouragement in the A.A. way of life.
2. I won't "fix" you or your problems, because I can't.
3. I will share with you how each one of the 12 Steps has become a tool that has helped me live my life more usefully and serenely.
4. I will help you see how the program of Alcoholics Anonymous can ease pain and loneliness.
5. I will help you develop your own tools in sobriety to deal more successfully with life on life's terms.
6. I'll help you move beyond your stuck places; I won't help you wallow in your suffering.
7. I will respect your time, your efforts and your confidences. I will require the same respect from you.
8. Because working the steps requires placing sobriety above everything else in your life - including personal relationships - I will expect you to avoid getting into a new intimate relationship while we are doing the steps.
9. Rigorous honesty is crucial. Don't expect me to work with you if you lie to me or fail to inform me of actions you knowingly take that could undermine your commitment to sobriety.
10. If my help fails to meet your expectations in any way, you may decide not to continue having me be your sponsor. Conversely, I may discontinue sponsoring you if I don't see you working to grow.
11. Once we have finished working the steps together, I will be willing to continue as your "maintenance sponsor" provided that you agree to: (1) call me at least once a week, (2) regularly attend at least two meetings a week, (3) continue to take AA service commitments, and (4) do periodic 10th Step inventories. If you relapse, I will encourage you to forgive yourself and to keep coming back. I will suggest that you work the steps again, with me or another sponsor, to seek a firmer anchor in sobriety.
12. Whether or not I remain your sponsor, I will continue to offer you fellowship and encouragement - and hope you will do the same for me.

BRIDGING THE GAP

We match interested people with AA members of the same sex, roughly the same age, and in the same neighborhood, to take them to their first AA meeting upon release.

Our Committee is looking at ways to improve communication regarding our services to volunteers and the AA community in general and would welcome your input at our monthly meeting. In 1947, the Northern California Council of Alcoholics had been established for communication to New York before there was a General Service Office as we know it today. These facts are important to set the history of the Hospital and Institution Committee of Northern California for its purpose as stated in the NCCAA Service Policy Book. This committee, the Hospital and Institution Committee, bears the tremendous task of bringing the message to those unfortunates in hospitals and penal institutions. It operates as a separate committee entirely self-controlled, but as part of the NCCAA." [From A Brief History of the Northern California Hospital and Institution Committee]

GENERAL SERVICE DISTRICT 12 – PREAMBLE HISTORY

The GSR Preamble stated below was created in the mid 70's for use by Area 9, located in Mid-Southern California. We recently adopted use of this same preamble at our District 12 monthly business meeting, in place of the AA Preamble, as do many of the 22 Districts that make up our Northern California Coastal Area.

Your group may have also held a Sharing Session on the 2009 Agenda Topic regarding adding the GSR Preamble to The A.A. Service Manual. The Conference did not take any action on this Agenda Topic, as the members of the Report and Charter Committee (remember, this is the committee that our Delegate David N. serves on for Panel 59, 2009-10) found out that the GSR Preamble is not widely known or used in all the 93 Areas that make up the United States and Canada. David explained the committee “felt the Service Manual should contain only conference-approved policy or Fellowship-wide practice, and the use of the GSR Preamble isn't there yet.”

The GSR Preamble

We are the General Service Representatives. We are the link in the chain of communications for our groups with the General Service Conference and the world of A.A.

We realize the ultimate authority is a loving God as He may express Himself in our Group Conscience. As trusted servants, our job is to bring information to our groups in order that they can reach an informed group conscience. In passing along this group conscience, we are helping to maintain the unity and strength so vital to our fellowship.

Let us, therefore, have the patience and tolerance to listen while others share, the courage to speak up when we have something to share, and the wisdom to do what is right for our group as a whole.
