Officer Reports:

Chair: (Sean McP.) Welcome everyone. We have a new form available for the reps use on the table with the agendas. Feel free to use it.

Vice Chair: (Doug S.) no report.

Recording Secretary: (Siobhan S.) April minutes were accepted as printed with no corrections.

Treasurer: (Shirley J.) Treasurer's report for April 2010: Group contributions were disappointing in April, more than \$6900 less than the prior April. Group supported expenses exceeded contributions by \$305, Bookstore expenses exceeded income by \$464 resulting in a \$627 net loss overall.

Registrar: (Rich S.) In April we had 360mtgs/week, 164 reps, for 45% group representation.

Bookstore Report: (Linda M.) Steve will be reporting on the bookstores loses in his report. Jim L., a longtime volunteer, passed away last week. In view of this sad news, we will be accepting applications for a Wednesday morning shift. The tentative date for the next inventory is Sunday, June 27th, at 12 noon.

Committee Reports:

ICSC: (Steve B.) The bookstore is doing well, in spite of showing a loss. The Loss appears to be a result of lower volume of sales. Costs seem to be in line with other Central Offices. We don't want to raise the price of books. We did buy books at a higher price, and may not have raised our prices soon enough. Perhaps \$100 in books has "walked out", or it may be a glitch in the new software. We would like (with this body's permission) to leave it alone for now and will talk about it some more if it is an issue.

Activities: (Kathy M.) The flyer for the June picnic is out! Sat June 19th, at Rincon Valley Community Park. Will have 2 speakers, and an ice table for salads. Speakers from 11-12:30, lunch at 12:15/30ish. Next event perhaps Hot August Nights?

Communications/Newsletter: (Brian Z.) there are lots of announcements in the newsletter. New mtg changes info. Will be rotating out at end of year, still looking for an apprentice.

HOSPITAL AND INSTITUTION COMMITTEE

"I woke up in a place staring at a blue pastel ceiling made of steel with a 40-watt bulb placed in its center. The air was damp and cool and carried an aroma of stale cigarettes. I turned my head to see, within my reach, silver bars made of four-gauge steel. The skin about my wrists still bore indentations halfway around where hand-cuffs once lay.

"Beyond the bars was another wall of bars. As my eyes traced across the cement floor, they came to a reddish brick wall. Halfway up the wall was a window the thickness of a Coke bottle bottom, its exterior encased by a steel mesh cover. Was it hell? It was snowing. I could not touch it and feel it numb my fingers like so many times before.

"It was raining. I could not smell the natural and multiple aromas it produced as new life seeped into the dry land. It was windy.1 could not let it blow through my hair or hear it moving through the trees. Now it was sunny. The rays were unable to nourish my flesh.

"What brought me here? I wish I could blame it on the woman I loved, but no! That would be too easy. Think. Was it resentment, passion, jealousy? Was it low self-esteem, loss of trust, self-pity? Was it fear or the total loss of myself? What brought me to this abyss of my life, with death just on the other side of the door?

"It was all of these feelings, but much, much more. There is something much more powerful than I, and I am powerless under its spell. Alcohol."—John R., Canon City, CO. [From The Grapevine, July 1989]


