

**Secretary:** (Jimmie B.) April 23, 2012 General Meeting minutes put forth and approved.

**Treasurer:** (Jimmie B.) Group supported income exceeded expenses by \$2,141. Group contributions for April were \$5,712 - \$193 more than April 2011. Bookstore income was \$7,825, exceeding expenses by \$284 -- resulting in a \$2,440 net gain overall.

**Registrar:** (Carolyn A.) Last month 227 groups offered 336 meetings per week in Sonoma County; there were 75 reps. at the April General Meeting for a 30% representation.

**Bookstore report:** (Linda M.) Currently fully staffed with volunteers. No dark shifts in April. ICSC authorized new chips vendor. Bookstore will have limited selection of four-color medallions. You can order in advance, just allow enough time for shipping.

ICSC: (Sean McP.) In past four months bookstore averaged a little over \$7,850 per month in sales and is meeting goal to break even in sales. ICSC has been looking at ways to cover cost of an assistant manager and at this time the committee feels safe to fill support position. The hiring process begins with the job announcement in this month's newsletter. Fliers are available and will also be distributed to District 12 General Service and local H&I meetings. Annie T. and Sean will be leading hiring process for ICSC. Any questions please contact them.

#### PI/CPC NEWS

#### How PI/CPC Brought Me to A.A.

When my first husband and I separated for the last of many times during our tumultuous 15-year marriage, I was pretty devastated emotionally and mentally. Fortunately for me, some graduate psychology students from a local university were completing some of the clinical hours they needed for their internship by providing counseling sessions at my youngest daughter's school ... free of charge! I was feeling very desperate to change my life right about then so the timing couldn't have been better for me and the price fit my tight budget.

I liked the young man who became my counselor, and felt comfortable enough to trust him right away. Near the end of my second visit, he said he would be gone for a couple of weeks and in the meantime, he wanted me to check out a couple of A.A. meetings and see what I thought. Although I was in huge denial about my alcoholism, (so I was very surprised when he suggested A.A.!), I liked and trust-

ed my new counselor and I was desperate to feel better. I was desperate to have a better life than I had been living, both for myself and my three teenage daughters, so I was willing to try anything.

I worked with a woman who had not kept it a secret from me that she was a sober member of A.A. I was very attracted to the serenity she exhibited, no matter what was going on around her. I knew I would ask her to take me to an A.A. meeting. Patty took me to a women's meeting in Rohnert Park and by the end of that first A.A. meeting, I think I was jumping up and down, hugging every woman who would have it (they loved to hug with no strings attached) and shouting, Eureka! I knew I had finally found the home I had been searching for my whole life! I went to at least four meetings and had asked Patty to be my sponsor by the time my counselor returned and I had my next visit with him.

That was more than 20 years ago and I have enjoyed all of the wonderful things that the fellowship of Alcoholics Anonymous has to offer since that day. I have had a life I never dreamed possible when I was still drinking and in the pit of despair. Words can't express the gratitude I feel toward that counselor and the PI/CPC (Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community) work that our District 12 PI/CPC committee does. That is how my counselor knew about A.A. So, naturally as I have grown in my sobriety and various service commitments, it seemed only natural that I would give back by becoming a member of PI/CPC.

Do you have you two years or more of continuous sobriety, worked the Twelve Steps and have a working knowledge of the Twelve Traditions? We would like to invite you to become an active, regular participant on our committee and you could be part of the service that cooperates with the professionals who work with the alcoholics who still suffer here in Sonoma County. It saves lives!

#### **BRIDGING THE GAP**

#### Bridging the Gap — A.A.'s 'Welcome Wagon'

One of my experiences as a member of the Bridging the Gap committee is that sometimes I have to make the phone calls to our volunteers to create the "bridge" for the member requesting help. On this day I was calling and leaving messages regarding a woman needing help coming out of detox, homeless and reaching out. I got a hold of another woman who said "Sure, I'll be glad to call over to the Orenda Center to reach out." About 20 minutes later this volunteer called me back excited, and hopeful for our prospect. Here is her story:

"I called over to talk to the woman and told her of the meeting I go to and how I would be glad to take her. She was ashamed of where the disease had taken her, and a little timid. I shared with her that the coffee maker of that particular meeting had been homeless two years ago and as a result of Alcoholics Anonymous, she was now showing up and doing the footwork and was a whole and useful member of society today. This really excited the prospect so much and she got tearful and shared how grateful she was for the call."

This particular volunteer was so excited to hear the hope in this prospect's voice she called and shared how much she got out of this simple gesture, the act of reaching out and carrying the message of "hope" to the alcoholic who still suffers!

Like this member of our Fellowship, we are all called to carry the message to the next suffering alcoholic — no matter who that may be. Sometimes it can entail making presentations to treatment centers and detention facilities, or making ourselves available for sponsorship, or welcoming newcomers at meetings, or, witnessing through the lives of others becoming purposeful and happy again. This is the gift we carry to others, wherein we find ourselves "happy, joyous and free."

#### SCIF presents "The Grapevine: A.A.'s Meeting in Print"

ttention all Grapevine/LaViña Representatives: The seminar on Wednesday, July 25 at 6:30 p.m. at the Bookstore is for you. Of course it's also for DCMs, GSRs, and anyone interested in this excellent magazine. It's interesting that when an individual volunteers (or is "volunteered" — aka railroaded) for the Grapevine Representative's (GvR) position that there are almost no instructions given to them on what they are supposed to do. "It's our meeting in print, it's \$28.97 a year, tell a joke" — and then point to the lending library and that is pretty much it. No "Pass-it-on" (instructions for the next trusted servant) is given. And frequently it's a newcomer that is nominated for this job. Who can expect them to even know to research the responsibilities? I believe this lack of information is one of the problems that have plagued the Grapevine (GV) over the years. We now know that we need to promote our magazine if it is to flourish. (Though let us not forget that in 2011 Grapevine reported a profit, and they expect even better things next year.)

For example, lots of GvRs don't realize they should register for instructions and information about the job. When you register you will receive a GvR starter kit with introductory material and a letter and you will also receive a password to access the GrapeNet Forum. (Which you probably didn't know existed.) I know I didn't before I became the Grapevine Chair for our district.

Besides being the voice of A.A.s in the present, the Grapevine is a powerful tool for recovery, reaching the isolated alcoholic confined to a bed or correctional facility, or the person stuck in gridlocked traffic on a Friday evening who is getting more frustrated by the minute. This seminar
