

#### **BRIDGING THE GAP**

I have had the pleasure and the privilege to be the telephone coordinator for Sonoma County Bridging the Gap for the last 2 years. All service in Alcoholics Anonymous is important and all of it helps keep me sober. But, without question, my favorite is working directly with newly sober alcoholics. There is something truly amazing about watching someone who has lost all hope and who looks at all of the people around them in Alcoholics Anonymous and thinks they must be liars or religious crackpots. It renews my own hope to see the new person's mind opening, out of sheer desperation, to the possibility that maybe the people around them do know how they feel, that maybe this thing could work for them, if they give it a try.

In Bridging the Gap, I would connect sober alcoholics who have had their lives transformed by this program with newly sober alcoholics who are just leaving the safety and security of the treatment centers. The newly sober alcoholics are transitioning from having a head full of information and ideas back into life. If they are to survive, they need first-hand experience with this kit of spiritual tools that really works in rough going. The alcoholics who have been sober for a while have a real desire to carry the message. As the phone coordinator, my favorite thing was hearing back from the guys who had been sober for a while who had met up with the newly sober guys and watched them take their first steps into a life of sobriety and service. The long-term sober alcoholics were more excited than the newbies. It always gave me a dose of that old time, A.A. spirit. What a kick. It has been one of my favorite service positions ever and I would recommend it to anyone.
