## BRIDGING THE GAP

Bridging the Gap (BTG) focuses on helping people leaving hospitals, treatment centers, or institutions attend their first A.A. meetings in their communities. Currently, we hold seven monthly and one weekly presentation meeting at various facilities in Sonoma County. At these meetings, two presenters conduct a one hour meeting including a short A.A. video, sharing how A.A. membership has changed their lives, and answering questions from the meeting participants. Information cards are distributed, which can be filled out with contact information if participants want to be contacted by an A.A. member when they leave their facility. Bridging the Gap is nationwide and we can provide contact information and facilitate hook-ups with A.A. members all across the nation. Newcomers and A.A. members are connected with emphasis on age, gender, and location. The idea is to try to connect people who can relate to each other.

There are several ways to contribute and participate in Bridging the Gap, including:

1. Attend the monthly business meeting on the 3rd Tuesday at 6pm at the bookstore.
2. Volunteer as a presenter at one of the local facilities in which BTG holds meetings.
3. Volunteer to be a contact person for someone wanting an A.A. member to escort them to their first meeting in their local community.

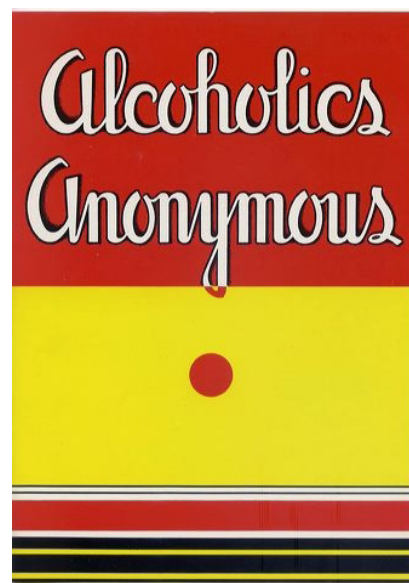
