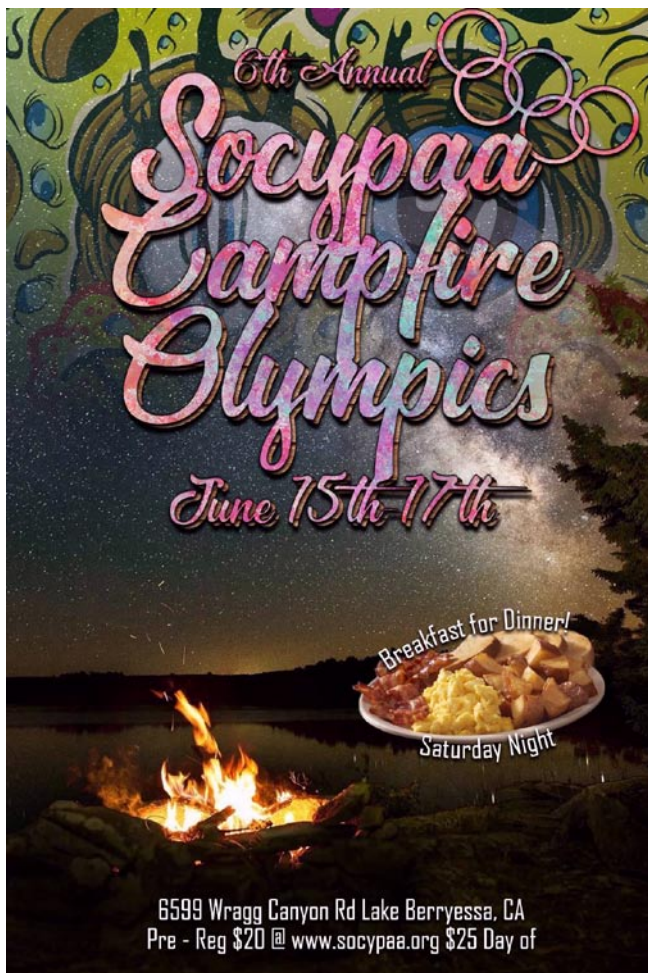

We are a two purpose committee. We provide information to the public on what AA is and is not and we work with the professional community to inform them about AA. This service includes presentations to Drunk Driver Prevention classes and to high schools. We are always on the lookout for young members of AA to speak with high school classes. One of our speakers tells them about AA and how to find a meeting. The other speaker tells their story. We will make this type of presentation to any group that requests us, including businesses that may be concerned about recovery for the alcoholic employee. We also put our schedules and pamphlets in places where the public may see and need them, like police stations and libraries. As people are released from the Sonoma County jail they will find our schedules displayed on their way out. We cooperate with professionals in the community such as within the court system, and in the medical and educational communities to explain our program and invite them to work with us. We have recently expanded into a Veterans Outreach program.

The work we do is front line service. It is exciting and fun. You may be the person with whom someone questioning their drinking can identify with. If you are interested in becoming a speaker or a member of our committee please join us! In addition to needing speakers, PI/CPC currently has 3 open committee service positions. We are searching for an Alternate Chair, and Liaisons for Bridging the Gap and Sonoma Valley Fellowship.

We meet at the employee underground lounge next to the underground parking at Santa Rosa City Hall (1st and D) on the 2nd Wednesday of the month. Our speaker training is at 7:00 pm and our service meeting is from 7:30 until 8:30. There is a 2 year sobriety requirement for our service commitments with the exception of young speakers, for which 1 year is required.

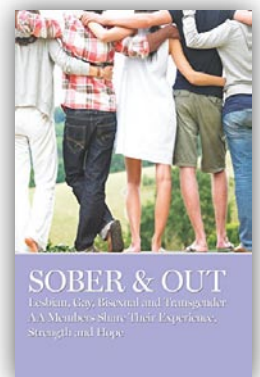

OFFICER REPORTS:

Chair: (James C.) I want to announce that we have found broker for inexpensive insurance for the groups in Sonoma County. My understanding is this insurance will run about \$75/yearly for any group that wishes to apply. I also understand that if there is a lot of interest in this insurance, that the price may well be lower than that per year. What I wish you all to do is take this information back to your groups, and I will send a clipboard around next General Meeting to see how many would be interested in obtaining this low-cost insurance, and we will begin the process of signing up any group who may be paying more to provide the necessary insurance to rent their space.

Vice Chair: (Justin C.) Welcome to our new reps, tonight we had 11 new reps.

Secretary: (Patrick B.) Previous minutes were passed.

Treasurer: (Carolyn A.) Group contributions for March were \$1,412 which was \$632 less than March of last year including \$4 in interest from bank income was \$1,416 and after expenses we had a net loss of \$1,853 Bookstore income was \$6,571 and after expenses we had a net loss of \$111. Overall, we had a net loss of \$1,964.

Registrar: (Craig H.) As of today's date, there are 231 groups in Sonoma County offering 347 meetings each week. There are 169 meeting representatives on record, for 67% participation. There were 69 representatives attending the January 2018 General Meeting, for 41% participation. There were 17 new reps attending the January 2018 new rep orientation.
