OFFICER REPORTS:

Chair: (Barry D.) Still in need of a CPA, which is a paid, contracted position. Quarterly contributions to be requested at your groups; less frequent contributions can cause a deficit in budget.

Vice Chair: (James C.) Eight new reps, next rep orientation will be on April 24th at 7:00pm.

Secretary: (Patrick B.) Minutes from February 27th SCIF General Meeting were approved.

Treasurer: (Carolyn A.) Group contributions for March 2017 were \$2,044, plus \$1 interest from the bank, for a total of \$2,045, which was \$15 less than March of last year. After expenses we had a net loss of \$1,764. Bookstore income was \$8,002 and after expenses we had a net gain of \$343. Overall, we had a net loss of \$1,422 and year to date we are \$2,152 less than 2016.

Registrar: (Linda W.) As of today's date, there are 243 groups in Sonoma County offering 363 meetings each week. There are 157 meeting representatives on record, for 64% participation. There were 73 representatives attending the March 2017 General Meeting, for 46% participation. There were 8 new reps attending the March 2017 meeting.

ACCESS SONOMA COUNTY

Access Sonoma County works to identify and eliminate barriers that make it hard for alcoholics to hear the life-saving message of A.A. Being blind, hard-of-hearing, or homebound are three issues that can make getting to meetings difficult. Recently, some of us got a chance to be of service to a member who reached out for help.

Six weeks ago or so, a woman called the SCIF Bookstore and said she needed a meeting to come to her in her home. She has been in need of a knee replacement for some time; her situation changed drastically when she broke the same leg. Isolated and in need of contact with the Fellowship, she found the courage to reach out. The folks at the Bookstore got in touch with our committee.

Two of us went to her home on a rainy afternoon. We took her some Grapevines, read part of Chapter 3 in the Big Book with her, and listened to her story. Two weeks later, we went again. This time, one familiar person went, and introduced a new visitor to our "friend in the bed". We're hoping to keep taking new folks in, to help build a support system. Good news is that she called one of us between visits, just to talk.

Could you spare an hour twice a month to carry the message to someone who can't get out to a meeting? H & I doesn't go to private homes, so it's up to the rest of us to be of service in these situations. Often, responsibility falls to our home group or our fellows. ASC is trying to help us look after anyone who falls through the cracks. It feels great to do this service--if you are interested, contact us. You'll find our information on the back page of the newsletter.
