



Chair: (Steve B.) Welcome everyone.

**Vice Chair:** (Trevor H.) New reps. that did not go to orientation please see Carolyn after meeting to sign in and see me for your orientation packet.

**Secretary:** (Patty G.) Aug. 27, 2012 General Meeting minutes put forth and approved.

**Treasurer:** (Jimmie B.) Group contributions for August were \$3,964 which is \$619 more than August 2011. After group-supported expenses, we had a net gain of \$908.Bookstore income was \$7,507 and after expenses had a net gain of \$447. Activities income was \$759, after expenses there was a net loss of \$296. Overall we had a net gain for Central Office and Bookstore of \$1,059.

**Registrar:** (Carolyn A.) Last month there were 229 groups offering 372 meetings per week in Sonoma County and at August's General Meeting there were 82 representatives for a 36% representation. There were 16 new representatives at the August meeting.

**Bookstore report:** (Sean M.) All is great. Gretchen is doing well as new Assistant Central Office and Bookstore Manager. Linda M. is leaving for Central Office Conference in Washington, DC, this week. Bookstore will be part of SCIF table at Unity Day. Please stop by.

**ICSC:** (Sean M.) ICSC stands for Intergroup Central Service Committee. We are responsible for the operation of the Intergroup Office/Bookstore as well as advising the Steering Committee on matters affecting SCIF's non-profit status. There are five committee members: SCIF chair and treasurer and three elected specifically for the ICSC for 18-month terms. In October and April the ICSC nominating committee presents to Intergroup representatives the individuals available to serve. Currently ICSC is cleaning up old business.

#### Finding a Way to Give Back to A.A.

Today, when I feel the rough ups and downs of life, I pause and instead of feeling badly, and self-centered, I count my many blessings and express gratitude for the many gifts in my life and for another day of sobriety. In fact, sobriety is the gift that I am most grateful for today. Today, I have a new life I never imagined possible when I was drinking and had lost all hope.

I was initially nudged into A.A. by my therapist who thought that my drinking might be clouding my thinking. She reported that A.A. was

a successful program for many alcoholics who gave it a chance. I later found out that my therapist knew about A.A. by pamphlets, speakers and health fairs associated with the PI/CPC committee, or Public Information in Cooperation with the Professional Community. It's been 14 years now that I have been a sober member of A.A., and I have to admit, I am not sure I would have found A.A. in such a timely fashion without her encouragement. For that, I am also so grateful.

It seemed so appropriate for me to give back by joining this committee. So I did, and I am happy to report it has been very gratifying and rewarding. Also, I am finally starting to re-

ally understand what this committee does and how fundamentally important this committee is to A.A. as a whole. In some areas, the PI and CPC sides are divided into two separate committees, but in our County, PI/CPC serves jointly under the General Service structure.

The purpose of the Public Information (PI) side is to develop and increase awareness in the groups and community that A.A. exists and that it has a program of success, helping those who want and need to grow away from obsessive and destructive drinking. Trained A.A. speakers will talk to the Drunk Driving Programs, probation departments, schools, health fairs, and clients of homeless shelters and any non-A.A. group that requests and AA speaker.

Cooperation with the Professional Community (CPC) is the part of committee that speaks with the professionals, making presentations to doctors, lawyers, judges, clergymen, mental health workers and any other professional who works with the public. These are professionals who come into contact with individuals who have a problem with alcohol.

PI/CPC service is a great commitment. If this service interests you and you have two years of continuous sobriety, please come to one of our committee meetings and check it out.

#### **BRIDGING THE GAP**

#### Different Methods, But a Common Theme

Some of you know that Bridging the Gap is a sub-committee that helps create a "bridge" for the newcomers getting out of a treatment facility or jail to their first A.A. meeting in their own home community. You may not know about the Workshop Weekend that takes place every year. I have asked our Area Chair from Bridging the Gap to share her experience why these weekends and our local forum we have are so important to continue this vital Twelfth Step work:

"The Bridging the Gap Workshop Weekend was held in Minneapolis on September 7-9. About 75 people from 16 states and two Canadian provinces attended. Although here in Northern California we call ourselves Bridging the Gap, other parts of the county, doing similar Twelfth Step service go under the name Contact on Release, Temporary Contact, or even Bridge the Gap (in the Midwest) and are organized under a Corrections or Treatment Committee. In San Diego County their Contact on Release is actually organized under their H&I Committee. Some temporary contact programs actually take A.A. meetings into their facilities, some areas have their own short-term correspondence program and some actually meet the inmates at the prison gates. But the common theme is always the same - carrying the message and extending the hand of Alcoholcs Anonymous.

There were panels of both Corrections and Treatment professionals, as well as speakers from the different areas talking about their temporary contact experience. The weekend has never been a disappointment and continues to inspire me. In 2013 it will be held in Chicago."
