BRIDGING THE GAP

How do I make sobriety attractive to those who are still suffering? I have them tell their own stories.

I am Michael D. I attend the Azure Acres "Bridging the Gap" service committee every second Wednesday to present the A.A. program of recovery from alcoholism to 30 men and women in this residential treatment facility.

Part of my presentation about recovery from alcoholism is to play a video that describes what is good about Alcoholics Anonymous in the hope that some of these clients will identify with us sober alcoholics and choose to pursue a life of sobriety. I encourage them to tell their own story. They may feel a connection to us because of our shared experiences.

I offer to have someone from their area meet with them after they get out and take them to their first A.A. meeting.

OFFICER REPORTS:

Chair: (Holly H.) The Alkathon lottery directly follows this meeting. The results of the lottery will be posted in the bookstore, and in the next Newsletter. Unity Day is coming up fast, and James could use a few more volunteers. Please see him if you are available to serve. The first Alkathon planning meeting is on October 1, and is listed in the newsletter. Please come if you are willing to be of service. Lastly, we have noticed that quite a few newsletters are getting thrown away at the bookstore every month, and at some meetings. The newsletters cost money, and part of the job of the Intergroup steering committee is to make sure that we are being financially prudent. We would like to know how many newsletters are being thrown away every month at your meeting. We are looking at possibly reducing the amount that are being printed, as we don't want to waste money, or be environmentally irresponsible. Please, try to take only one bundle of newsletters per meeting, unless your meeting is very large.

Vice-Chair: (Barry D.) Those new reps who did not attend the orientation tonight should arrive by 7:30 p.m. next month to attend the orientation. Include phone number and email when signing in. Five (5) new reps tonight. Top info to take back to you meeting.

Secretary: (Jennifer R.) The General Meeting minutes of September 2015 were put forth and approved.

Treasurer: (David B.) Group contributions \$2,568; individual contribution of \$2,971 for a total of \$5541. Bookstore income was \$6,755 and expenses were \$6,976 for a loss of \$221. Year to date income is \$13,238 which is \$9,619 more than last year.

Registrar: (Madeleine T.) In August there were 221 groups offering 344 meetings per week in Sonoma County. There are currently 117 groups that regularly send a rep to the General Meeting. There were 85 reps at August's meeting. New reps are encouraged to sign in on the correct day of the week (clearly marked). If a rep is an alternate or just picking up items for another rep, please sign in using the rep's name, meeting time and day.

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting adjourned at 8:40 p.m. with the responsibility Statement.



ACCESS SONOMA COUNTY

Last year I sponsored a woman in a residential treatment program who lacked family support to care for her two children while she attended a meeting. We were creating a structure to support her sobriety and combed through the Sonoma County Meeting Directory to find meetings where she could take her kids along.

Much later I found the two-page Access Sonoma County *Group Policies about Children at Meetings* list. It includes meetings that describe themselves as child friendly; child tolerant (meaning well-behaved children may attend); meetings with restrictions by age; and a few meetings where the group conscience has designated no kids. This list is available at the bookstore and from the ASC committee. How I wished we had known about that list!

Access Sonoma County is updating *Group Policies about Children at Meetings*. Listen for announcements from Access about how your group can be included in this list to help parents/caregivers find a welcoming meeting.

Has your group had a discussion and taken a group conscience on whether children are welcome or not? Each group decides its own policy. Some groups even provide childcare and have well-established procedures on how they recruit the volunteers and pay for the space.

An ASC sub-committee is looking into how groups do this so we can share your experience with other groups that may want to provide childcare during meetings.

We encourage you to attend your home group's business meeting and ask that your group take a group conscience and communicate it to Access so we can make this information available to parents or legal guardians who need to bring a child along so they can participate in the life-saving grace a meeting can provide.

Our responsibility statement states that I am responsible when anyone reaches out for help, I want the hand of A.A. to be there. How are we doing for our members with kid responsibilities?

Spread the Word About A.A.

We can all practice the Twelve Step with many people who are not alcoholics. Doctors are a perfect example. PI/CPC has literature available to pass out to doctors. This literature is tailored for the medical community and answers questions about Alcoholics Anonymous that can be passed along to patients.

Another Service PI/CPC offers is to have informational meetings with the medical community. Some doctors have asked us to meet with their staff so they can learn more about alcoholism including how to recognize someone with a problem and where to send them for help. This is a way to educate staff members so they can pass along information about alcoholism to patients.

You can get involved in this process as much or as little as you like. You can pick up an envelope at the bookstore near the entrance and take it to your doctor's office. Passing along information is easy. I handed the envelope to my doctor and she immediately referred me to a member of her staff who has a spouse with a problem. I shared a meeting schedule and my phone number with her so she could offer it to her loved one.
