







Chair: (Barry D.)Tonight we will hold the Alkathon Lottery with several events coming up. Thank you to James C. for covering me during last month's General Meeting.

Treasurer: (Carolyn A.) Group contributions for August were \$6,304 which was \$3,736 more than August last year. After expenses, a net gain of \$3,362. Bookstore income was \$6,821, after expenses a net loss of \$221. Overall, we had a net gain of \$2,987 and year to date \$2,593 less than 2015.

BRIDGING THE GAP

My name is Derek and I'm an Alcoholic. My sobriety date is 7/16/14. The significance of that date, to me, rests in the commencement of a journey of exploration, growth and spiritual clarity. Prior to that date, I felt as if I were driving on a twisty, bumpy road to nowhere.

Through the program of Alcoholic Anonymous and working the Twelve Steps I understand that there is so little that I understand. Most days I even believe it. That what is happening around me is real, but that very little of it can be consumed by the senses. Where I go astray is when I start thinking I can have some influence on the world, figuratively "taking the wheel."

I feel that I have only the barest of grasps on what constitutes "sobriety." I don't drink and I haven't died (yet). I've got that much figured out. We all know there is much, much more to sobriety than that. Trying to put names, textures and definitions on the nuances of our common journey eludes me. This causes further anxiety. That I'm smart enough to figure this thing out a bit more than I have.

To fill the gaps and voids, I find that I have to be open to God's will and to act upon it. It calms my mind and body. It reminds me that the things I can't see, the amount of which seems to grow daily, are mysteries that probably aren't my business. It's God's business. This is my faith. But it still causes me trepidation in sponsorship. That I don't have the requisite grasp on "sobriety" to carry the message to the alcoholic who suffers. That I don't have enough of a kit together to give another man a foundation upon which he can begin to build his "sobriety."

I've been told that there are other ways to conduct Twelfth Step work besides sponsorship. Even though ideas were given to me I was still stuck in my thinking that "sponsorship" was the only way. That was until I gave my first presentation for Bridging the Gap. I was able to carry the message of hope.

While I still move along in my journey and allow it to strengthen my faith, while I allow myself to be open to God and while I still await the blessing of a willing sponsee, I remain grateful. Grateful that I have the sobriety that I do, grateful that I have God in my life and grateful that I have the blessing to carry the message to an alcoholic through work with Bridging the Gap.

PI/CPC

Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community is a subcommittee of General Service. We distribute A.A. literature throughout the community and to jails, police stations, senior centers, homeless shelters and other places where someone might need to know about A.A. PI/CPC also makes presentations to groups that are not necessarily alcoholics. One speaker talks about our program and what one might expect at their first meeting. The other speaker tells his or her story. Most of our presentations are at drunk driver education (DDP) classes and high schools. We also make presentations to any group that requests us. We have made presentations to businesses, unions and, recently, the Sheriff's department.

I personally love speaking about A.A. to DDP classes. These are my people. Occasionally we see the light of understanding enter the eyes of some of the attendees. It also may come much later, and we may have planted that seed. Speaking before non-A.A. groups has taught me to avoid jargon, bad language, and to remember what it is like to hear about our program for the first time. I find it very rewarding and very good insurance against the next drink. If you are interested in this type of service, come to our business meeting on the 2nd Wed. of each month. Speaker training is at 7pm and the meeting is at 7:30. Elections take place in November.
