

OFFICER REPORTS:

Chair: (Patty G.) Instead of electing a new Chair for activities, the Steering Committee decided to form an ad hoc committee to coordinate activities for the remainder of the year. It is co-chaired by Leekiesha H. and Lori S.

Vice Chair: (Tina C.) Those new Reps that didn't attend orientation should arrive by 7:30pm next month to attend the orientation. A reminder to all Reps to make regular Intergroup announcements at your meetings.

Secretary: (Donna L. – temp.) The General Meeting minutes of July 22, 2013 were put forth and approved.

Treasurer: (Jimmie B.) Group contributions for July were \$5,076 which was \$417 less than July of last year. Individual contributions were \$50. After expenses, we had a gain of \$1,475. Bookstore income was \$6,797 and, after expenses, had a gain of \$387. Overall we had a net gain of \$1,862.

Registrar: (Carolyn A.) Last month there were 230 groups offering 370 meetings per week in Sonoma County. At July's general meeting there were 63 reps for a 27% representation.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Bookstore: (Linda M.) Group contributions pay to make pamphlets, meeting directories, wallet cards and newsletters free for everyone. Most fellowships in Northern California charge for these materials. Bookstore will have Grapevine book, "Emotional Sobriety, The Next Frontier" on sale in September for \$11 while supplies last. Bookstore is fully staffed with volunteers, with openings expected in the future. If you're interested in volunteering, come and fill out an application. Requirements include 1 year sobriety and knowledge of 12 steps and 12 traditions.

ICSC: (Jim W.) Committee is working on Assistant Manager replacement, and hopes to have someone on board by next general meeting.

Activities: (Lori S.) Halloween dance planning is going well. Next meeting is Sept 3 at 7:30pm at Round Table on Occidental Road in Santa Rosa.

Alkathons: (Richard H.) Meetings can now sign up for all three alkathons. Volunteers are needed to sign up for kitchen shifts. Also looking for an artist to design a coffee mug.

Communications/Newsletter: (Barry D.) Please take only the number of newsletters you need, and use what you take. It is also available online at sonomacountyaa.org. In the middle of the September newsletter you'll find a copy of tonight's motion, and room on the back for notes. Please read the newsletter and share both content and events with your group.

Outreach: (Ben G.) Went to two unrepresented meetings and got one new rep. Passed around list of unrepresented meetings so reps can

sign up to visit one or more, and encourage group to get rep.

Seminars: (Trevor – temp) The next seminar is on September 25 and will cover the First Tradition. Info in newsletter.

Teleservice: (Joe B.) There are 42 active shifts, making someone available on the hotline 24/7. Two open shifts: Thursday 11 a.m.-2 p.m. and Sunday 1-5 p.m. Contact info on back of newsletter. Requirement includes one year of sobriety and worked the Twelve Steps.

LIAISON REPORTS

SOCYPAA: (Cassidy S.) Meet the 1st and 3rd Sunday of each month at 7:15pm. They have events coming soon.

Spanish Central Office: (Rosa S.) The North Central office meets on Saturdays 4-6 p.m. at 1700 Corby in S.R. District 18 is having 20th anniversary on Aug. 31 at 1015 Petaluma Hill Road.

Unity Day: (Laurie E.) Info. is on front of newsletter. Remind groups this is a potluck. Dog on the Roof group is organizing potluck. Still need set-up and clean-up volunteers. Next meeting is Sept. 11 at 6 p.m. in the bookstore. Gretchen is Chair; her contact info. is on back of newsletter.


October's Bookstore Sale Selection

Benefits of a DUI ... Class

I've always been drawn to the service commitments that involve newcomers (like Bridging the Gap and H&I) since finding the solution to my drinking problem in Alcoholics Anonymous. I have to constantly remind myself this is a program of attraction, not promotion. I've found hope here. When I acquired two years' sobriety I jumped at the chance to try a different commitment with the PI/CPC (Public Information/Cooperation with the Professional Community) committee and speak at DUI classes.

I had no idea the benefits I would receive by getting involved. Last month I spoke to an evening class as the second speaker; sharing my experience, strength and hope. One of the attendees was a man from my work. I was able to share and "not regret the past, nor wish to shut the door on it" and stress anonymity. More recently, I was the first speaker sharing what A.A. is, and is not, and general information. The second speaker was a man I had never seen in a meeting (his home group is a stag meeting) with much longer sobriety than me. He was awesome! I learned so much and I really enjoyed myself.

The PI/CPC committee also distributes literature throughout the county such as meeting directories and the "So You've Been Told to Go to A.A." pamphlet. We would like more committee members, and members available to be liaisons between other service entities (BTG, H&I, etc.) If you would like to be of service, come to our monthly business meeting, at the City Hall underground lounge the second Wednesday of every month with speaker training at 7 p.m. followed by the meeting at 7:30 p.m.

Helping Others Walk Through Fear

My name is Marjorie F. and I'm an alcoholic, currently serving as the secretary of Bridging the Gap. I am always impressed by how wide the reach of this committee is, and the true service that it provides. Presenters from BTG go into treatment centers and jails to bring information directly to fellow male and female alcoholics. Those who are interested in using this valuable resource fill out cards, which are then followed up on by volunteers who offer to meet the newcomer at a meeting upon release. Men are matched with men, and women with women. This is a critical time for the newcomer to get connected to A.A. in the community.

I have been a recipient of this service. I remember how scared I was to attend outside meetings when I graduated from Azure Acres years ago. I wanted to stay sober but didn't know anyone in A.A., which might have kept me from attending. Making a personal commitment to meet the woman from BTG at a meeting "forced" me to walk through the fear and begin trudging the path of happy destiny. I am eternally grateful for the service she provided.
