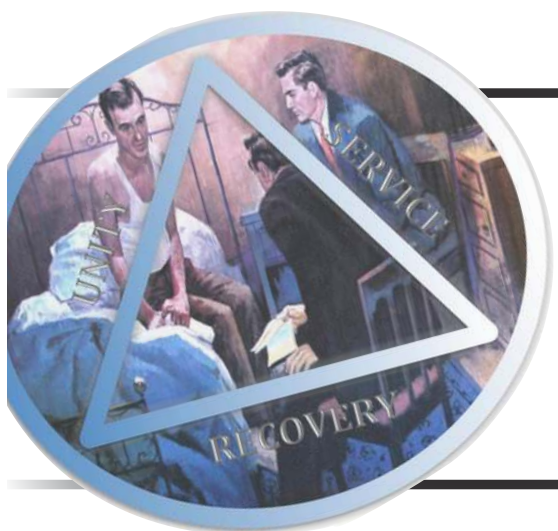

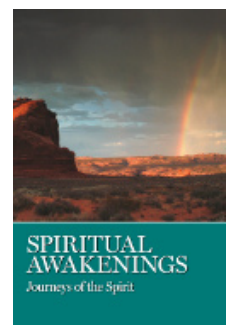

## ACCESS SONOMA COUNTY

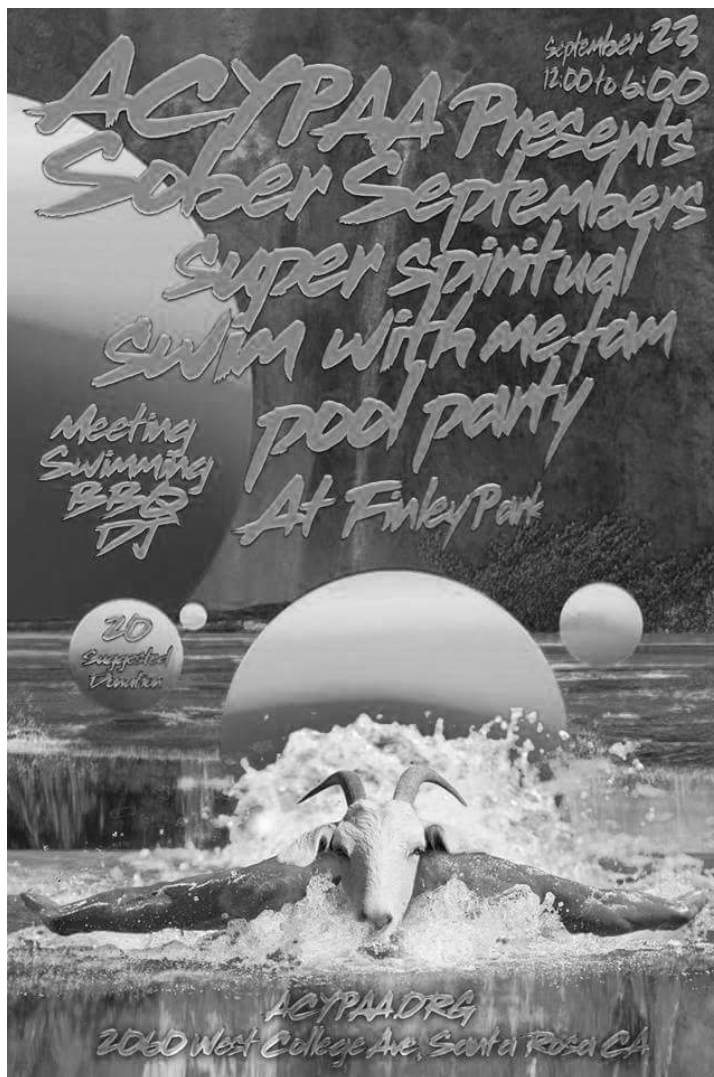

**Chair:** (Barry D.) Thank you James and Andy for filling in at the July SCIF steering and ICSC meetings.

**Vice Chair:** (James C.) Eight new reps tonight. August 28th will be the next orientation.

**Secretary:** (Patrick B.) Minutes from May business meeting were passed.

**Treasurer:** (Joseph J.) Group contributions for June were \$4,753, plus \$1 interest from the bank, for a total of \$4,754, which was \$1,985 less than May of last year (2016). After expenses we had a net profit of \$1,382. Bookstore income was \$5,816, and after expenses we had a net profit of \$3,217. Overall, we had a net gain of \$3,582, and year to date we are \$1,678 behind where we were in June, 2016

**Registrar:** (Linda W.) As of today's date, there are 239 groups in Sonoma County offering 359 meetings each week. There are 160 meeting representatives on record, for 67% participation. There were 72 representatives attending the June 2017 General Meeting, for 45% participation. There were 12 new reps attending the June 2017 meeting.

**BOOKSTORE REPORT:** (Carolyn A.) The bookstore is fully staffed with volunteers at this time. Although there isn't a sale book for August, we have a huge assortment of A.A. literature, including the entire collection of Grapevine books. Come browse our CDs and tapes, cards and gifts, and information from neighboring fellowships. It's a friendly, cool place to drop by on a hot summer day.

**ICSC:** (Esther S.) We oversee bookstore operations, and the bookstore is running efficiently. Recent inventory went well.

**UNITY DAY** (Nick R.) Unity Day will be held Sept 30 at Enmanji Buddhist Temple in Sebastopol. General Service is hosting it this year. Volunteers are needed, as well as potluck items.

## PI/CPC

As part of my desire to be sober I have always tried to do service work. It really makes me feel part of the community of A.A. Several years ago I started showing up at the Public Information & Cooperation with the Professional Community (PI/CPC) business meetings. I am currently the Schools Coordinator as we go to high schools and give presentations. I have also participated in presentations at DDP classes, the Sheriff's Department and, recently, Sonoma County Behavioral Sciences.

We inform as to what A.A. does and does not do, then have a speaker tell their story much as we would do at a regular A.A. meeting. We inform the public about A.A., with the idea that we might help someone get to their first meeting. If it helps just one person, then it is worth it. A sponsor told me many years ago "when you help someone else, you help yourself" so I'm also trying to ensure my own sobriety. The suggested sobriety time for being a presenter is 2 years.

We meet in the employee lounge at Santa Rosa City Hall on the second Wednesday of the month. Speaker training runs from 7-7:30 pm, and our business meeting is from 7:30-8:30pm. We are currently looking for "young" speakers (anyone under 40 yrs old) to go to high schools this fall. The sobriety requirement for young speakers has been lowered to one year and a working knowledge of the twelve steps. We are also in need of a couple of people to do outreach to the community and veteran's organizations. So, if you're looking to do some service, just show up and join us.
