
Exciting Times for PI/CPC

Looking Ahead at District 12, General Service!

Welcome to Autumn, Sonoma County! Here are a few things that A.A. General Service is up to - in Sonoma County, and beyond.

Aside from the business of keeping Sonoma County connected to the broader world of A.A., our trusted servants have been giving presentations on their job descriptions, to attract candidates for a new panel of officers and committee chairs. So stand up at elections in November, and state, **"I am available!"**

On April 13 & 14, 2019, Sonoma County District 12 General Service will be hosting the California Northern Coastal Area 06 **Pre-Conference Assembly** at the Veteran's Memorial Building in Santa Rosa. This is the big one! It's the only 2-day Assembly, of CNCA's calendar, where General Service Representatives from Northern California, come together to share their groups conscience with our Area Delegate. These group shares can affect AA as a whole! We're early in the planning stages. But, for an event of this size, we'll need a lot of support. Ask your group's GSR how you can help.

Here's some news from the General Service Office in New York (collected from Box 459 - GSO's quarterly newsletter):

"Beating the drum" for their cause, Native American members, with the help of AA World Services, translated the Big Book (audio) into the Navajo Language. Good job! Dave M., past Delegate from Area 3 (Arizona) sees no end to the goodwill inherent in the translation. "Not only do we believe this will pay great dividends by carrying the message to the Navajo Nation, but there is an added benefit," he said. "The deep spirituality flowing from the Native American people will come back to broaden and enrich the spirituality of the AA Fellowship."

A YouTube channel has been launched for AAWS and GSO. It can be found at: www.youtube.com/AlcoholicsAnonymousWorldServicesInc. This will provide another platform for AAWS produced videos to be easily shared by a broader audience. Our ability to carry the message to alcoholics, the general public and the professional community is enhanced.

A pamphlet supporting Spanish-speaking women in AA was requested at the General Service Conference, 2018. The trustees' Literature Committee is seeking a diversity of recovery experience from Spanish-speaking women in AA. Manuscripts should be 500-800 words, double spaced in 12pt font size.

Chair: (James C.) All handouts to host a meeting for the alkathons are at the table at tonight's meeting.

Vice Chair: (Justin C.) We had eight new reps tonight at orientation.

Secretary: (Patrick B.) Minutes were passed.

Treasurer: (Francis B.) Group contributions for June were \$7,054 which was \$2,282 more than June of last year, we received \$4.00 in interest from bank, making total income \$7,058, and, after expenses we had a net gain of \$3,343. Bookstore income was \$5,998, and, after expenses we had a net loss of \$833. Overall, we had a net gain of \$2,510.00.

Registrar: (Craig H.) As of AUGUST 13th, there were 235 groups, in Sonoma County, offering 349 meetings each week. New sign-in sheets are still in the works. Constructive suggestions are welcomed. There are 171 meeting representatives on record, for 67% participation. There were 74 representatives attending the June 2018 General Meeting, for 41% participation. There were 2 new reps attending the July 2018 new rep orientation. If you missed the new representative meeting, it is held at 7 pm and is put on by the Vice Chair. So, be sure and attend next month.

ICSC: (Andy M.) We have Glenn's review for the bookstore done and everything is perfect.

BOOKSTORE: (Glenn Cooper) The "group insurance fee" listed as income under both Central Office and Bookstore columns in the Financial Summary are the amounts collected (\$50) from meetings for the insurance we are now offering to meetings under the Bookstore's insurance policy. A reminder that the bookstore will be closed on September 3 in honor of Labor Day. The September sale book is *AA in the Military*; 20% off regular price of \$16.99 or \$13.59. We are collecting books for Lake and Mendocino counties until Mid-September. Intergroup donations can now be made by debit or credit card here at the bookstore.

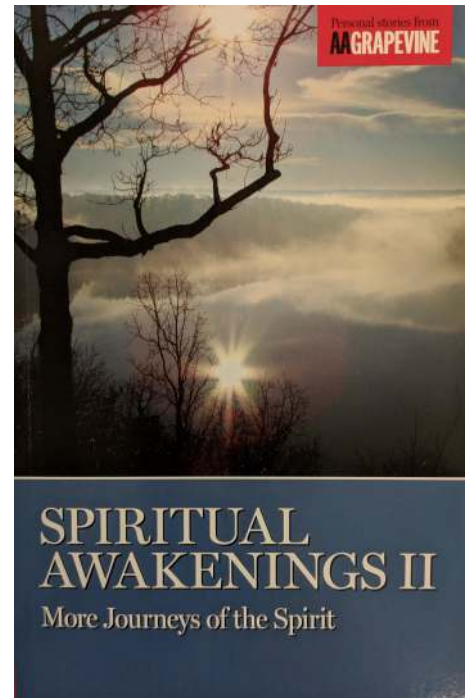
