GENERAL SERVICE

Let's step up and make ourselves "Available" for AA service positions.

We had our Sonoma County General Service District elections last night and there was a marked contrast between how many people were in attendance vs. pre-pandemic numbers. We had thirty-five voting members last night, in person and on Zoom, and pre-pandemic that number was more than eighty! It's my understanding that many of our other service committees, such as Intergroup, H&I, PICPC, BTG, and Access, are having some difficulty filling all of their open positions. At least there are many fewer representatives in attendance than in the past. What is happening?

Some are perhaps still uncomfortable being in-person due to health concerns. However, many service groups have hybrid meetings and some even remain online. All I know is that Sonoma County has had a reputation in the past as one of the healthiest and most active AA communities in our General Service Area and I'm hoping we can achieve that level of involvement again.

What does it mean to be "available" for AA service? All it means is that we are willing to commit our time and energy to support the program that gave us our life back. I've been sober over 40 years and I believe one of the keys to my staying sober has been always having a service commitment. That has been as simple as having a meeting level commitment like coffee maker, secretary, treasurer, etc. Alternatively, it has been serving on one of our various service committees, as a meeting representative or as an officer. There is no shortage of opportunities to serve.

Many of us feel like we aren't qualified, but that is generally not the case. The most important attributes are to be enthusiastic (hopefully), and to be willing to learn how to do a new job in AA. I say hopefully enthusiastic because when I began my second stint as a GSR in 2019 I was in a rough spot emotionally and a bit grumpy. I brought my body, and fortunately my mind and heart followed. I've found my service niche in General Service. I hope you can find yours somewhere in this miraculous program and ensure your own sobriety. You also will help to ensure that the program is there for the still suffering alcoholic that hasn't found us yet.

Total expenses for September include \$2,310.00 from central office and \$58.00 from Teleservice for a subtotal gain of \$2,173.00. The Bookstore income for September 2022 was \$6,152.00 and \$138.00 from Activities. Total expenses were \$6,878.00 for the bookstore leaving a subtotal loss of \$588.00. Overall, for this month we had a net gain of \$1,585.00. Year to date our income is \$91,270.00, our expenses are \$79,303.00, leaving a gain of \$11,967.00
