



TREASURER: [Meghan A.] Central Office income for November 2022 includes \$3,907.00 from Group Contributions and \$1,324.00 from Individuals and \$25.00 from Group Insurance for a total of \$5,256.00. Total expenses for November include \$2,232.00 from central office, \$93.00 from pamphlets & cards, \$300.00 from the Newsletter and \$59.00 from Teleservice for a subtotal gain of 2,572.00. The Bookstore income for November 2022 was \$6,279.00 and \$25.00 from Group Insurance. Total expenses were \$7,131.00 for the bookstore, leaving a subtotal loss of \$827.00. Overall, for this month we had a net gain of \$1,745.00. Year to date our income is \$115,789.00, our expenses are \$100,801.00, leaving a gain of \$14,988.00.

REGISTRAR: [Hilary G] As of end of November 2022, there were a total of 216 Groups in Sonoma County offering a total of 388 meetings each week: 242 meetings are in person, 117 on Zoom, 29 Hybrid. At November General Meeting, there were a total of 46 Reps in attendance, 7 of whom were New Reps. 18 attended on Zoom, 28 in person.

INTERGROUP TREASURER'S REPORT - DECEMBER 2022

Central Office income for December 2022 includes \$2,625.00 from Group Contributions and \$978.00 from Individuals and \$25.00 from Group Insurance for a total of \$3,628.00.

Total expenses for December include \$5,924.00 from central office, \$250.00 from the Newsletter and \$59.00 from Teleservice for a subtotal loss of 2,605.00.

The Bookstore income for December 2022 was \$5,558.00, \$25.00 from Group Insurance. \$4,096.00 and \$390.00 from Unity Day. Total expenses were \$6,788.00 for the bookstore, \$4,193.00 for the alkathons and \$38.00 for activities leaving a subtotal loss of \$950.00. Overall, for this month we had a net loss of \$3,555.00.

Year to date our income is \$129,486.00, our expenses are \$117,817.00, leaving a gain of \$11,669.00.
