
BOOKSTORE HOURS HAVE CHANGED

GENERAL SERVICE

The Spiritual Life is not a Theory

I came into A.A. with a belief that everything happens for a reason, at the time it's meant to (even if the reasons are unknown). I believe that to be true, even more so today. What I've learned through working this program of recovery, is that rather than resistance or force, the act of surrender is vital step I must continue to take if I want to keep the life of freedom and happiness, which I can honestly and gratefully say I am living today.

My first three years of sobriety I attended innumerable meetings, but I had not worked the 12 steps nor taken a commitment to be of service, as suggested. Although crucial for me, solely eliminating alcohol was clearly not creating the life I wanted; my pain and misery had actually been growing. Finally, I became willing to go to any lengths.

About a year after completing the steps with my sponsor, feeling happy – joyous – free for the first time in sobriety and in life, I received an email inviting me to a Workshop Planning Committee Meeting. At the time I didn't know the sender, how they got my email address, or how my presence could possibly be of any use to this committee, or to me. I could have justified ignoring the email. Old me definitely would have. But the new me, the one I wanted to be, remembered that sometime all I need to do is show up in order for something to happen for which I'll later be grateful for.

That meeting turned out to be the Planning Committee Meeting for an upcoming Access Workshop. I felt so welcomed by this group of fellows that I kept showing up for these weekly planning meetings. I had no formal role or commitment, but I think I had helpful ideas along the way. Then I was asked if I'd be willing to Emcee the workshop. I was terrified but willing. Willingness to show up and do the best of my ability; it hasn't failed me yet. This year I was elected Chair of the Access, a sub-committee of General Service. I attend our monthly Committee Meeting, as well as our monthly meetings for our district, officers, and area. I am surrounded by a growing group of my fellows; most of whom have far more general service experience than I have, and all have shown me encouragement and support.

I didn't know where the path would lead when I read that email, but I chose not to resist its suggestion. Rather I surrendered and showed up with nothing except an open mind and a bit of faith. My heart is filled with gratitude for the friendships and experiences I am gaining though being of service. Access Committee has become a significant part of my recovery and it plays an important role within our fellowship as well as for those who may have not yet found all that A.A. has to offer. We are dedicated to helping make A.A accessible to everyone who reaches out for help.

Access is now planning another workshop for which we are gathering information. There will be a survey circulating our fellowship, locally, soon. It will ask members about what topics are of interest. When you see it, please take the time to provide your feedback. If willing, make yourself available to help plan the workshop. Or show up to another committee's meeting. All you need to bring is an open mind and a bit of faith.

This suggestion from an anonymous friend could be your opportunity to walk a path that may lead to more joy and love than you can imagine today.

We have to live it.

PI/CPC

I recently got involved in PI/ PCP in December of last year. I heard from a few folks that just a couple people were pretty much running the whole deal. I thought I might step up and try and help. I have been around the AA program for guite a few years and never really understood what this group's focus was until now.

Turns out that PI / PCP stands for Public Information / Cooperation with the Professional Community. We work with school's, hospitals, libraries, and other groups to share the A.A program with them . We focus on the purpose and general information to get the A.A. program known to these various groups. The 12 steps and 12 traditions are introduced along with the concept of anonymity and how it is preserved.

I am currently serving as a speaker coordinator for the D.U.I .classes, which are on zoom at this time . Two members from the program share their experience and knowledge of the A.A. program at these classes. The first speaker lists the basic information to the group while the second speaker shares a little about how the program works in their life. We are continuously adding members to our speaker list, which has been established for many years now . What I have learned from the committee members is that we share our experience... We are not experts in the recovery process.

Please consider adding yourself to our list. A speaker orientation is done once a month at the business meeting, which is held the 2nd Wednesday of the month. Please check the calendar fr details.



INTERGROUP TREASERER'S REPORT - JANUARY 2023

January 2023 - Central Office

Total income for January 2023 includes

\$6,832 from Group Contributions, \$761 from
Individuals and \$75 from Group Insurance for

a total income of \$7,668.

Total expenses for January include \$2,811 from central office, \$111 from pamphlets & cards, \$340 from the Newsletter and \$59 from Teleservice for a subtotal gain of \$4,347.

The Bookstore income for January 2023 was \$5,743 and \$75 from Group Insurance.

Total expenses were \$3,465 for the bookstore, \$3,457 for cost of sales and \$480 for the alkathons leaving a subtotal loss of \$1,584.

Overall, for this month we had a net gain of \$2,763.

Year to date our income is \$13,486, our expenses are \$10,723,

leaving a gain of \$2,763.
