When I raised my hand for a general service position...

In AA we practice right action, but right action sometimes means doing things opposite of your impulses. Similarly, AA trusted servants operate within the upside down triangle of responsibility: the more responsibility you have, the “lower” you are on the triangle, and the more people you serve. When I raised my hand for a general service position, I had no idea what I was getting into. I just raised my hand, and the journey started. I served as GSR, general service representative, to the Occidental Tonight Group in West Sonoma County. I don’t think I did a very good job, and I often wanted to quit, but I made an agreement with myself (and my sponsor) to stick it out. Near the end of my term, I raised my hand again – but this time for a district-level position. Again, I had no idea what I was getting into, but things had started to change within me. I began to see AA from an entirely new angle, and it kind of blew my mind.

Right now, I am Archives Chair for District 12, Sonoma County, serving Panel 73 alongside other trusted servants. This position keeps me sober simply by being of service to others alcoholics, but through general service – and studying the Twelve Concepts for World Service – I’ve learned so much more about AA, particularly its structure of governance.

Today I’m meeting my service sponsor (it’s a thing!) as we read through the AA Service Manual. We’re on Concept 5, which discusses the *right of appeal* or what we call *minority opinion* when taking a group conscience. All this is so interesting to me because I tend to be a utopian thinker, believing that humans are capable of harmonious living even in complex societies. This means there needs to be a structure of governance that values and takes seriously both the majority vote (strict democracy) AND the minority vote. What I’ve learned through general service is that the minority opinion really matters. And here’s how: it strengthens unity. Concept 5 speaks of the often-demonstrated wisdom of minorities and how the tyranny of the majority can weaken the spirit of fellowship (or sameness) that insures our survival as alcoholics.

I would never have guessed that raising my hand for general service would mean that I would become willing to sit down with a sponsor every two weeks and study AA’s twelve concepts. And, in being willing, that I would become hopeful again – just as I did when I first studied the steps – about the possibility of a peaceful future. Studying the twelve concepts isn’t easy (better to do it with a sponsor!), but it is a gem. The twelve concepts explain how and why AA has survived for so long amidst tremendous social and political tumult. And because I also want my sobriety to last a long time, I keep raising my hand for service, and surprising myself with how much there is to know about AA. There’s a lot of good stuff in the concepts. I had no idea.

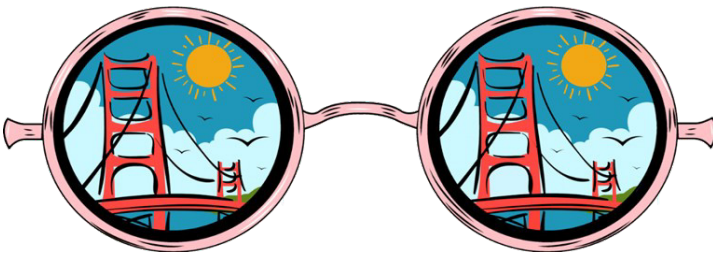
