Aside from word of mouth and internet searches, how does the general public become informed of what AA is/is not, and if AA might be something they or someone they know wants to try? Did you ever wonder what kind of information about AA the professional community has, so that it may distribute that info to interested parties or those in need? Well, that's exactly what PI/CPC is all about! Our PI/CPC subcommittee stands for Public Information / Cooperation with the Professional Community. We carry the message by getting in touch with and responding to the media, schools, industry, and other organizations which can report on the nature and purpose of AA. We inform professionals and future professionals about AA - what we are, where we are, what we can do, and cannot do. We find simple and effective ways to cooperate without affiliating.

I get to participate in this subcommittee by serving as the recording secretary. Being a trusted servant for PI/CPC has absolutely helped keep me sober and connected to the fellowship in ways that surpass regular attendance at my home-group. 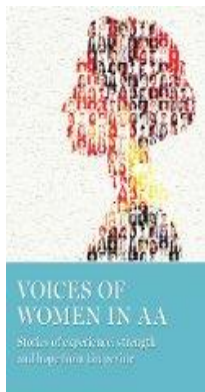

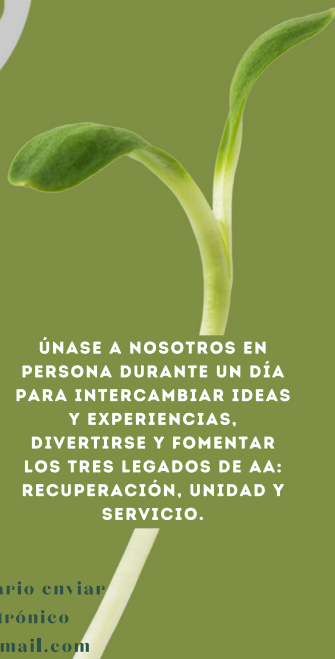

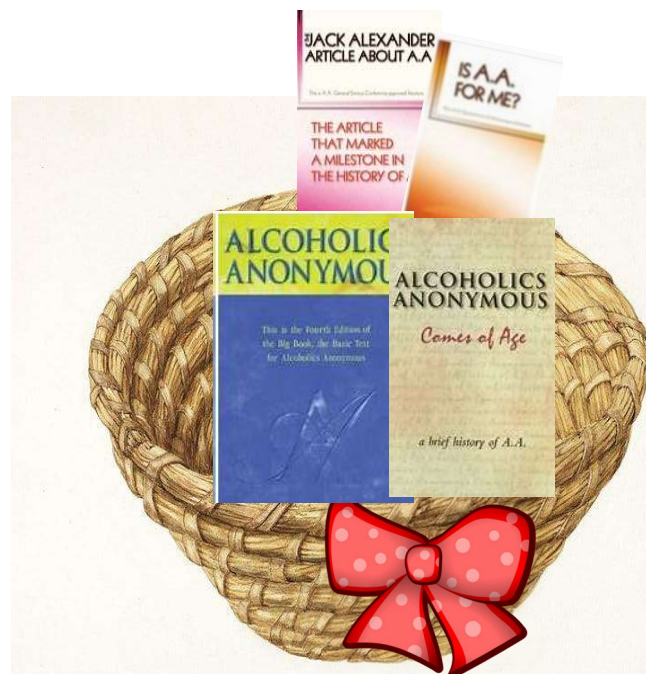

Treasurer – Meghan L: The Bookstore income for June 2023 was \$7,448. Cost of good total \$5,538. Total expenses for June were \$4,354 for a subtotal loss of \$2,444. Central office income for June 2023 was \$5,780. Total expenses for June were \$3,410 for a gain of \$2,370. Activities income totals \$78. Activities expenses total \$1,257 for a subtotal loss of \$1,179. Overall for the month we had a net loss of \$1,253. Year to date our income is \$75,477, total cost of goods is \$25,517 and our expenses are \$46,339, leaving a gain of \$3,621. In Service, Meghan Lewsis

July Financials 2023 The Bookstore income for July 2023 was \$5,622. Cost of good total \$5,397. Total expenses for July were \$3,642 for a subtotal loss of \$3,399.

Central Office income for July 2023 was \$8,092. Total expenses for July were \$4,308 for a gain of \$3,784.

Activities income totals \$497. Activities expenses total \$0 for a subtotal gain of \$497.

Overall, for this month we had a net gain of \$882.

Year to date our income is \$89,693, total cost of goods is \$30,896 and our expenses are \$54,217, leaving a gain of \$4,580.

Other expenses include a correction to the reporting of annual contributions for a total of \$10,000. Overall, there is a total loss of \$5,420.
